This house is located on rural mountain, where smoke wreathed, and landscape changed by seasons. On account of the owner's experience of living aboard and the wish to keep the memories eternally, we used modern American style in interior decoration. Besides, because the hostess is Japanese, we also added Japanese cultural features into decoration. A large amount of white color was used to create comforting and relaxed feeling in the spaces. In public spaces, we created seamless floors with Pandomo which not only make the spaces look more extensive, but also ensure the floor is easier to clean. Moreover, the warm, earthly grey floor made the house exude elegance and serenity.



TV wall, kitchen walls, and arched ceiling were built with Shirasu-kabe, which is a non-toxic and eco-friendly wall plaster material with humidity-controlling and odor-eliminating properties. On the ground floor, the family relationship can be strengthened by having great time together in the extensive living room and the open kitchen with island.



On the second floor the children can study and communicate with each other in the open study space. Public spaces in the house were strengthened with functionalities to bring the family closer to each other.



The third-floor area was arranged to be the couple's space, where has a master room, dress room, and a bathroom. In the double-sink bathroom, they can effectively finish their morning routine. At the end of the corridor, they can overlook the beautiful mountains in the open working space.





In master bedroom, the edge of ceiling was decorated with arch shape, and the line design on ceiling brought layered effect, besides, large wood elements accentuated Japanese style.



On the fourth floor, the guestroom was set up for hosting overnight guests. Elevators, floor heating system, and smart home system were utilized to optimize functionalities of this house, to create the more convenient life.
