

While police investigations into the cause of their deaths continue, the Mater Catholic College and Mater Dei Primary

communities have rallied around the family, offering support to Mrs Langfield, who is the religious education co-ordinator at the college.

Neighbours of the small

cul-de-sac expressed their sadness and loss yesterday, describing the Langfields as "a happy family and the nicest people".

Reflecting on the tragic turn of events at weekend they

wrote, "just a tragedy; our street will remember this day for a very long time. RIP boys".

Family is torn apart after dad, son killed

HICKORY Place in the outer Wagga suburb of Glenoak was eerily quiet yesterday as police continued their investigations into an alleged murder-suicide which claimed the lives of 13-year-old Patrick Langfield and his father, Ray.

Police and paramedics were called to the Langfield's family home just after 8am on Saturday where they found Patrick's body

The body of his 43-year-old father, Ray, was later located a short distance from the home.

Police say Ray's wife, Debbie, and their two youngest children, aged 11 and eight, were home at the time the deaths occurred, but they were not physically harmed.

The street was closed to traffic on Saturday as forensic investigators combed the scene, collecting evidence.

Police have revealed no firearm was used in the deaths.

While the street was reopened to traffic yesterday morning, several police cars and the mobile command centre remained at the front of the Langfield's home as investigatook photos of the affluent

neighbourhood.

Wagga Local Area Command Inspector Mark Murphy said while the deaths were being treated as a murder-suicide, police would be conducting a wide investigation to

gauge the nature of the incident and any contributing factors.

"The crime scene is still continuing," he

"We need to speak to a lot of people, family and friends, to gather background information and rule out other scenarios.

"We can't say any more." He said any "little snippets" of informa-

tion that become available could change the investigation.

News of the tragic incident spread quickly at the weekend.

Loving tributes have flowed for Patrick a year 7 student at Mater Dei Catholic College and former Mater Dei Catholic Primary School captain - and Ray, a licensed aircraft maintenance engineer.


Inspector Murphy said post mortems would be carried out in coming days.

It is hoped those results, coupled with police inquires, will be able to shed some light on the investigation.
