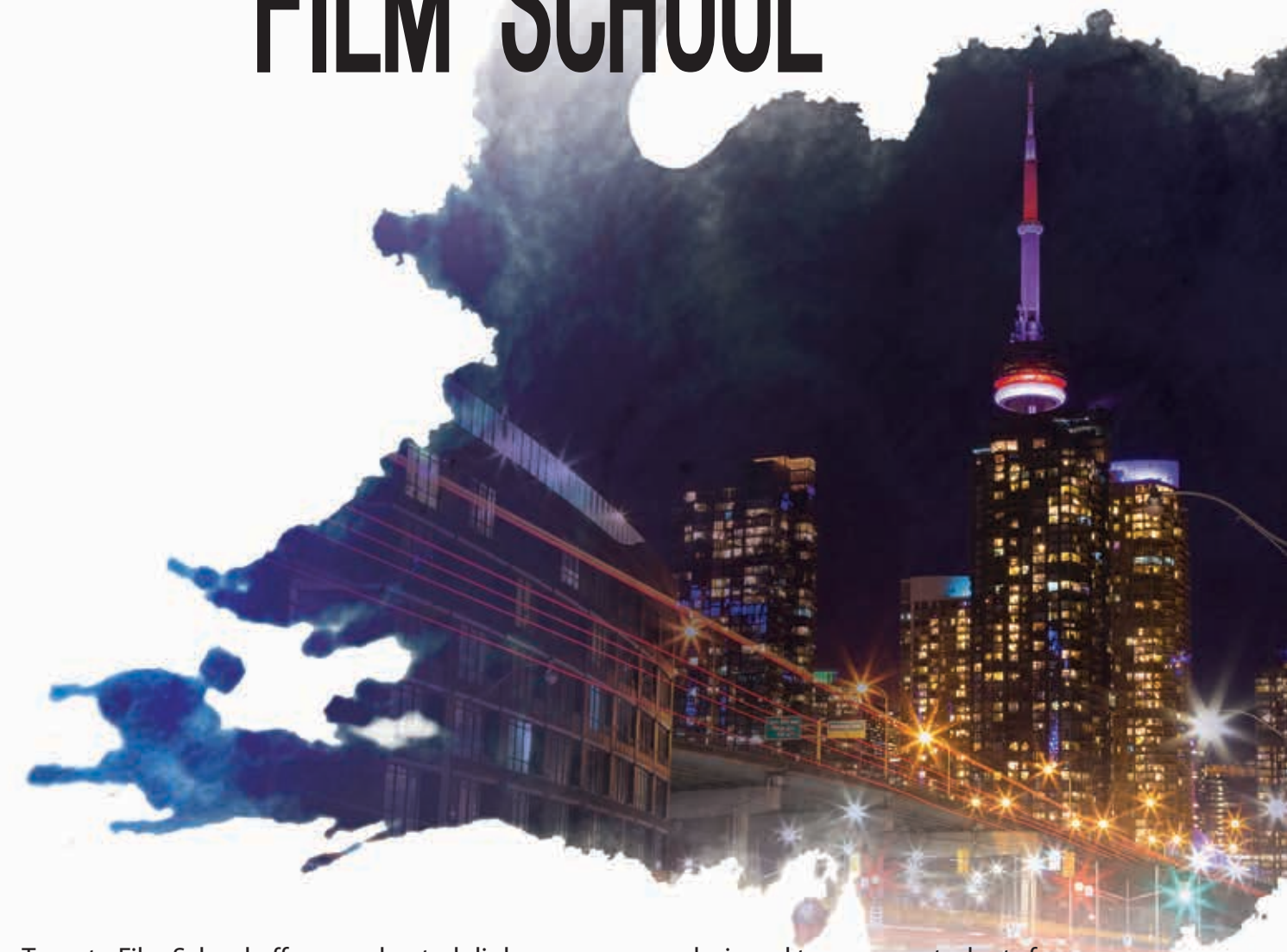

From print to new media, graphic designers are the visual thinkers who translate mood and message into communication. If you are creative with a passion for the visual landscape, the Graphic Design & Interactive Media Diploma will prepare you with the skills and confidence to launch a design career in only 12-months.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

At Toronto Film School, you develop the creative, technical and business skills to bring engaging films to life, from concept through to delivery. You will work with students and instructors who share your passion for film and learn how to translate great stories from the page to the screen.

The Film Production Diploma is designed as an 18-month intensive behind-the-scenes education in all aspects of film making. Through a combination of compelling lectures, demonstrations, guest speakers, exciting field trips and hands-on projects you will be guided through all the phases of preproduction, production and post production. You will write and breakdown screenplays, develop storyboards, create shot lists and prepare budgets and schedules. You will learn to shoot, direct, block, light scenes and capture audio. You will then learn to assemble, cut and manipulate footage in the various editing stations while learning to meet deadlines and the various delivery specifications.

During your time at the Toronto Film School you will collaborate, initiate and develop projects in a wide array of disciplines from documentaries, to commercials and public service announcements, short films, music videos and even begin to develop that feature you've always had in mind, while being mentored by leading industry professionals. PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Toronto Film School's 18-month program uses the Stanislavski Method (living truthfully under imaginary circumstances) to effectively blend a film and television acting focus with the critical foundations of stage technique. Through a practical, hands-on approach, you will explore all artistic, technical and business areas of acting. Not only will you learn the foundations of acting for the camera and stage, from movement to voice and improvisation, but you will also be trained in voiceover, hosting, screenwriting, pitching, producing, directing, video editing, auditioning and career management. At Toronto Film School you will have the unique opportunity to collaborate on acting projects with film production, writing and video game students.

You will leave the program with a professional portfolio filled with a complete range of theatrical and film performances from short films to voiceovers and a professional downtown stage play, including:

While working in a recording studio, you will learn microphone techniques and professionally record voiceovers for commercials, narration, animation and video games.



Camera Acting

You will train as an actor on camera in a workshop environment and through on-set experience. Studying with professional actors and directors, as well as collaborating with student filmmakers and screenwriters, you will learn techniques for working in front of the camera and develop acting skills for Film, TV comedy/drama and show hosting.



Theatre Acting

Through the "Stanislavski Method," you will learn the craft of acting for the stage and explore voice and movement, from classic to contemporary scenes and monologues. You will also learn improvisation and musical improv, physical theatre and stage combat. You will perform as a character in a professional play directed by a professional director at a downtown Toronto location.



Producing and Directing

You will learn how to write, video edit and plan the production of a short film in which you will star. You will also learn how to cut a demo reel of your acting work. 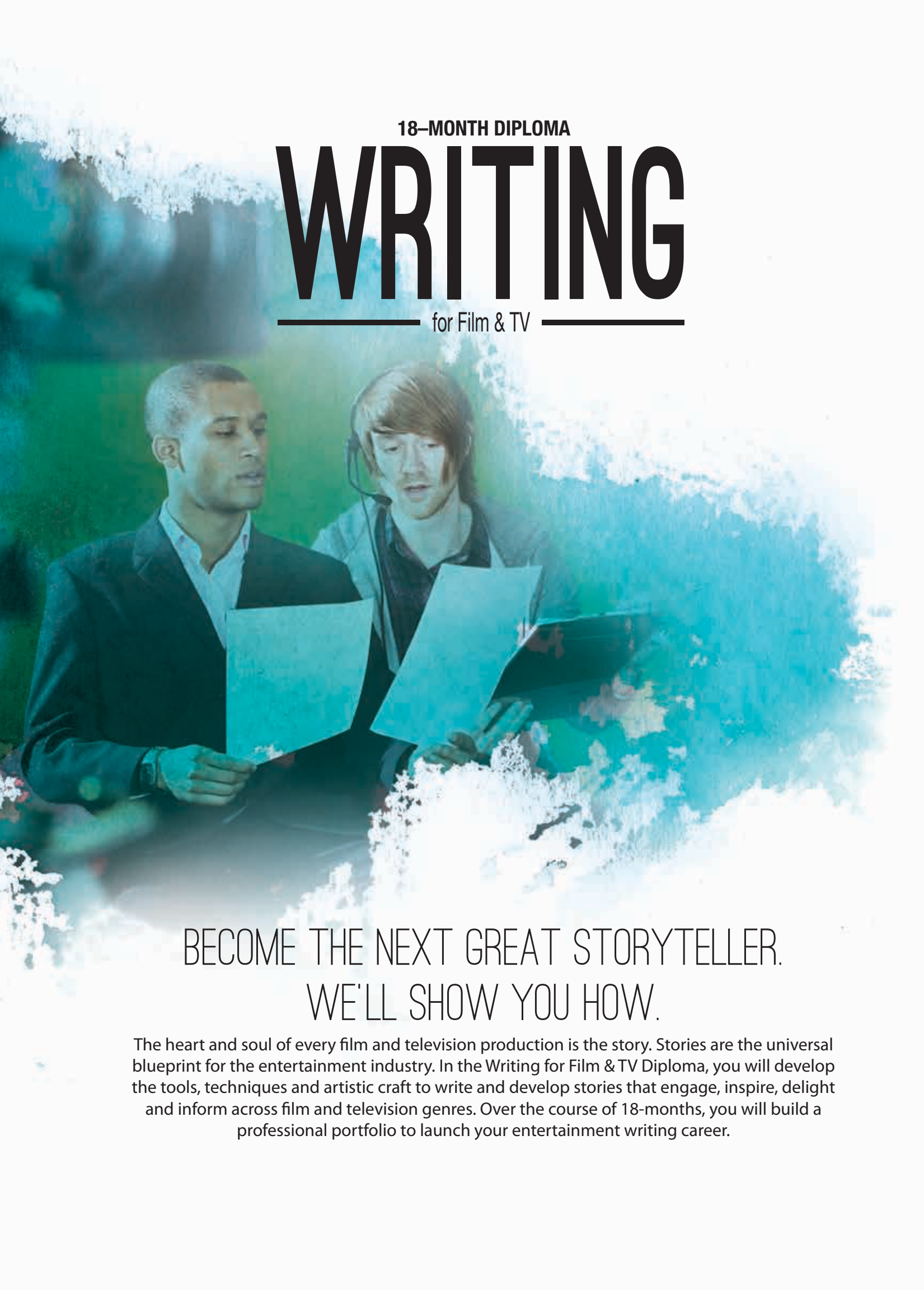

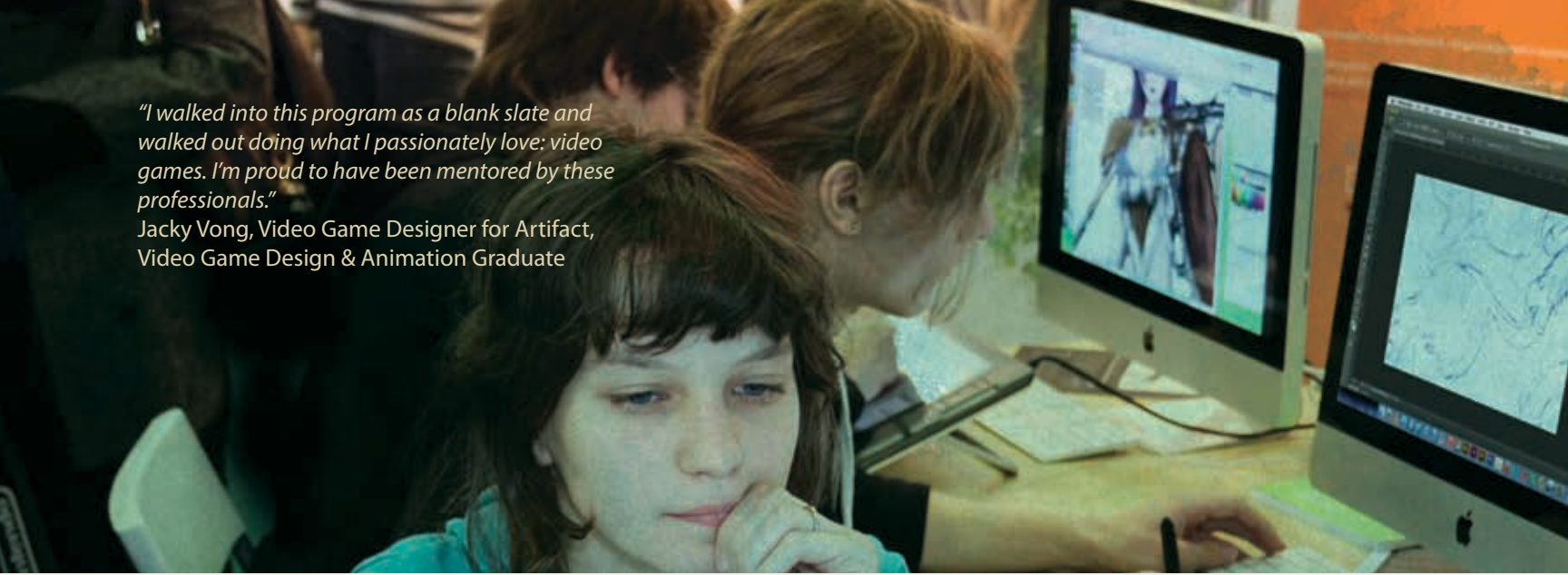
