Interviewer: Miss Elsa tell us about the book's story, what inspired you the most?

Elsa: its something so close to my heart, it is about a mother's courage and a fight for what's right I will start it with a short story as I always loved to hear from my mother in my childhood,

This is a story of a strong mother who fought for her child, but before I begin to tell you the story I will ask you what is courage to you? An ability to fight for what's right, an act of bravery. Well it all starts with a girl named Almira, when she was a child she always wanted to go to school like her brother but her parents wouldn't let her go, because the village she was born forbids a girl to study and go out of the house as there was strict male dominance there. She always asks her mother why a girl has no right to get an education, but her mother always scolds her and tells her that a girl must be a housemaker. She has to obey whatever the man says and decide, women have no right to ask silly questions. As time passes by when Almira turns 12, her family gets her married to a man twice her age, she gives birth to her first child at the age of 16 and named her Amna. When Amna was born she always saw herself in her daughter, when Amna turned 7 she started to ask questions the same as her mother. Why is she not going to school? Almira was very kind and open that she would make her father let her go to school one day. One day Almira asked her husband that if she wanted their daughter to get an education he refused, again Almira forced him to let her go to school. He refused again, Almira made the decision that she will make her husband convinced to get her daughter to the school. Whatever she learnt from her brother's books in her childhood she taught her daughter and against all odds she went and admitted amna to the government school her husband was very angry at her but she made him realize that a woman also has some dreams that she wants to fulfil. After this, the villagers treated Almira's family very rudely but after Amna became the first topper in the whole district board, everyone was shocked and they finalized that a girl can do the same as a boy there is no difference between them. Amna is now a lawyer and she is fighting against injustice.
