- Because Instagram only allows for a specific media release, companies and activists can only post 1-10 posts at once. It might be challenging to create one square infographic as you wouldn't fit much. However, the option to do ten posts offers a more educational opportunity.
- 2. Each of my posts are feminist activism posts, yet I did include one with the hashtag "#hoodfeminism." Hood feminism touches on the women who are often left out of the loop, although they were the ones who helped initiate the movement. The posts I chose seemed to focus on the strengths and the different experiences of all women.
- 3. I think each of my chosen posts reflects a different portion of feminism. Still, I also feel that there is always a common ground through the differences, whether through intersectionality or shared experiences. The hood feminism post is a 10-page swipe-through of hood feminist quotes from women who often get swept under the carpet. The other two focus on the strength of women; one went so far as to list different experiences that make women strong. Subsequently, they teach why we need to "change the way the world views female strength.
- 4. I believe these posts clarify my understanding of feminism because my article focused on feminism's goal to empower women because women genuinely are capable of so much more. A quote from RBG stuck with me, "Women will have achieved true equality when men share with them the responsibility of bringing up the next generation."
