**Paul Crewe**, QB, Penn State

**Earl Megget**, RB/WR, Boise State

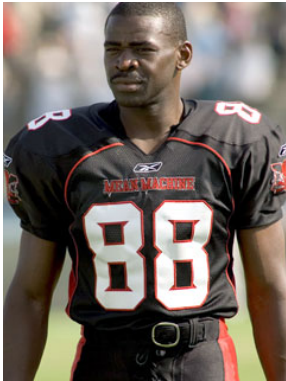


**Pros** – Fastest feet in the draft with the ball in hand, the definition of a human joystick, get him the ball underneath the linebackers and watch him burn

**Deacon Moss, WR, Miami**

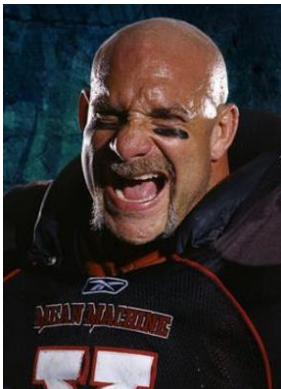


**Pros** – Prototypical No 1 wideout; wins contested catches down the field in single coverage or double coverage, high character and proven college level production

**Joey Battle Battaglio, MLB, Alabama**

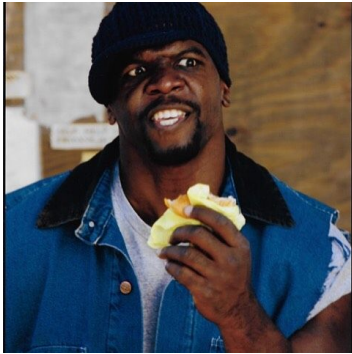


**Pros** – Hardest hitting linebacker in the draft, takes absolutely no prisoners on the field or in the showers, commits hard on the runner

**Brucie, QB/K, New Mexico State**

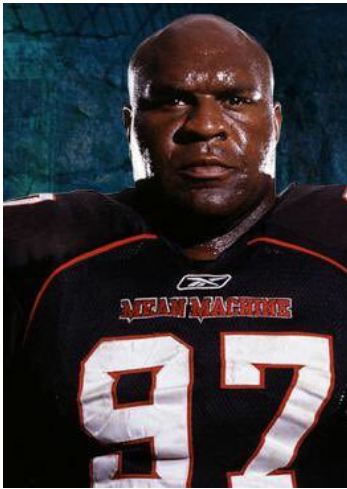


**Pros** – Sheesh...

**Switoski, DT, Auburn**

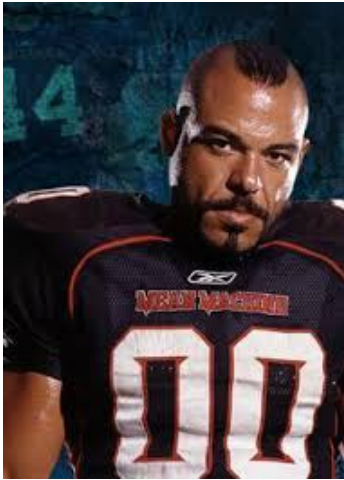


**Pros** – Huge body and fantastic motor, his leverage immediately puts linemen off balance, great nature and influence in a team, loves feasting on the QB

**Torres, SS, Clemson**

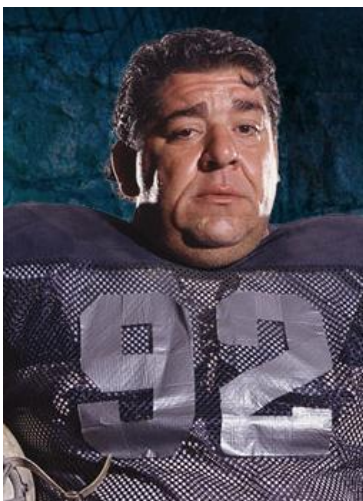


**Pros** – Brutal delivery on the hit, great in run support, able to exert dominance and fear on the defence and sets a tone with how hard he plays
