200-bed nature cure hospital to come up in Mandya district

To provide yoga, naturopathy treatment, research facilities

BENGALURU: The Central Council for Research in Yoga and Naturopathy will set up a first-of-its-kind 200-bedded Nature Cure Hospital and Research Centre in Karnataka.

The proposed facility will come up at Puttanahalli, in Nagamangala taluk in Mandya district on a 16-acre plot. The construction of the proposed centre is expected to be completed in 20 months. Under the ministry of Ayush, the post-graduation institution would offer yoga and naturopathy treatment besides research facilities for those pursuing higher education in the subject. The hospital will have separate treatment sections. Besides the out-patient department (OPD) and general wards, there will be special and deluxe wards.

The Centre of Excellence will offer a three-year course in Doctor of Medicine (MD) for yoga and naturopathy. Ten students would be admitted every academic year to each of these courses. The number of seats, the ministry states, would be increased over a period of time. Besides, fellowship programmes and PG diploma courses would be offered.

Pending for over a decade
The state government has allocated the land while the Centre has sanctioned Rs 72 crore for the facility. The proposal that has been pending since 2004, is finally taking shape with the foundation stone being formally laid. Though the state government had handed over the land for the hospital in 2006, the proposal had not materialised. The Union government had agreed to grant Rs 25 crore

when the initial proposal was made.

The facility was proposed to have 100 beds. The new plan states that it would have 200 beds, according to H Sreenivasiah, chairman, Gandhi Bhavan, who had first sent a memorandum to the Ayush ministry seeking establishment of the centre. "As a naturopath, I believe that we must head to a drug-less therapy as it is sustainable. Yoga and naturopathy make it possible," he explained.

'Proposer' not invited
Even as Union Minister for Ayush, Sripad Yeso Naik, laid the foundation stone for the event recently, no invitation was extended to H Sreenivasiah. He said that he was the first to send a memorandum to the Union government a decade ago seeking the setting up of the institute. **DH News Service**

Govt plans 'education complexes' on pilot basis

To consolidate lower, higher primary, high school and higher secondary divisions

BENGALURU: The state government will attempt to create education complexes on a pilot basis in the coming academic year, said primary and secondary education minister Tanveer Sait.

"We will start one Urdu school in each taluk, with support from the minorities department, and one Kannada medium school. The schools will be in two stages of Class 1 to 8 and 9 to 12," Sait said, speaking to *DH*. Cluster-level surveys for the implementation of the pilot have been undertaken and training of teachers has begun, he said. Existing infrastructure will be used for the purpose. He was participating in a workshop and convention on education organised by Karnataka State High School Assistant Masters' Association on Monday.

The government had received a report which suggests the present divisions such as lower primary school, higher primary school, high school and higher secondary, be consolidated. "An education complex which houses classes 1 to 12 is the need of the hour and this practice exists elsewhere in the education sector. It may

help to ensure retention of students and minimise dropouts. To test it out, we are undertaking this pilot project," he said.

The government wants to run the schools on the model of Adarsha Vidyalaya - schools set up under the centrally sponsored scheme Rashtriya Madhyamik Shiksha Abhiyan (RMSA). "Several primary school teachers were concerned about their seniority being affected by such a move but I have promised them that this will not be affected," he said. Further, he added that the No Detention Policy will be rolled back to Class 5 starting from the next academic year.

Sait said that in urban areas, as far as possible, it will be ensured that students do not write the exams in their own school.

"Students will be allotted exam centres different from their schools to ensure that the exams are conducted fairly." In rural areas, it has been planned to consolidate two to three villages or one hobli and have one exam centre. "Since rural students may find it difficult to travel, we will make some changes to the plan," he said. **DH News Service**

Dutta to take office as DG&IGP today

Restoring reputation of controversy-hit force his main challenge

BENGALURU, DHNS: The 1981-batch IPS officer Rupak Kumar Dutta will take over as the 33rd Director General and Inspector General of Police (DG&IGP) of the state on Tuesday. Dutta will receive the baton from outgoing DG&IGP Om Prakash at 5 pm at the police headquarters on Nrupathunga Road. He has nine months' service to implement his priorities as DG&IGP. He will retire on October 31.

A meeting headed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday decided to relieve Dutta from his current central assignment as special secretary (internal security) in the Ministry of Home Affairs to facilitate his return to his home cadre - Karnataka. The government had finalised the name of Dutta for the coveted post on January 27 and had informed the Centre about the decision.

Dutta was promoted as special director, CBI in July 2016. Prior to that, he was additional director in the CBI and looked after anti-corruption (HQ) zone. "Prime Minister Narendra Modi has signed the relieving order and I have received the order. I will reach Bengaluru and join duty on Tuesday," Dutta told *DH*.

"I am extremely happy to be back in Bengaluru. It's actually homecoming for me. Karnataka is my state. It is my cadre. It really feels good to be back in my cadre," he said.

On taking over as the DG&IGP, he said, "I am yet to get official communication from the state government. I will join duty in the state cadre and follow the government order."

Formalities will be completed in the morning to facilitate the way for Dutta to assume office. The government will immedi-

ately order him to take over from Om Prakash. All IPS officers and other senior officers have been informed to be present at 5 pm when Dutta assumes office, sources in the Home department told *DH*.

Dutta is expected focus heavily on Bengaluru, coastal belt which faces the challenges of communalism and terrorist activities and IT-related crimes. He is likely to address graft cases as he is well aware of the situation, due to his stint as ADGP (Lokayukta). Moreover, he supervised two Supreme Court-monitored probes into 2G spectrum allocation and coal blocks allocation, while serving in the CBI.

"I will spell out my priorities only after taking charge," he said.

Retired DGPs have welcomed the government's decision to appoint Dutta as DG&IGP. Developments in the recent past like constabulary's threat to go on mass casual leave, suicides by a few officers and resignation by some others, charges of harassment by top brass and lack of understanding between seniors and subordinates have affected the morale of the police force. Dutta should address such issues and restore the reputation of the force, they said.

152 women among 1,888 cops promoted; some after 20 yrs

Parameshwara: gov't will set up panel on police pay revision

BENGALURU: Nearly 2,000 police personnel were promoted at a ranking ceremony hosted by the Bengaluru city police at Palace Grounds on Monday.

Home Minister G. Parameshwara awarded head constable badges to police constables who were promoted and single stars on head constables who were promoted as assistant sub-inspectors. In all, 1,888 police personnel from the city police constabulary were promoted, 152 of them women. A majority of them were from the City Armed Reserve and the others from law and order and traffic.

The home minister congratulated the constables, some of who were promoted after 20 years of service. He also said up to 1,000 police personnel will be promoted next month. "The rank of a constable is equivalent to that of a second division assistant in the revenue department. But after 15-20 years of service, an SDA would get promoted as deputy tahsildar, whereas a constable remains a constable. I took this up with the chief minister who readily understood the issue and asked me to resolve it," Parameshwara said. The minister also proposed several schemes for the welfare of policemen including revision

■ Twenty police stations will have toilets and restrooms for women.
■ Department to appoint 1,700 new police constables for Bengaluru by next month and make a requisition for 3,000 more before the Home Department.
■ Rs 11 crore will be used for repairs on police quarters in the city, says Police Commissioner Nagen Sood.
