NEET document verificationgoes past midnight

BENGALURU. DHNS: Medical and dental seat aspirants had to wait till midnight and beyond on Saturday to get their documents verified at the Karnataka Examinations Authority (KEA) office on Saturday.

Candidates and parents, who arrived at the KEA office at Malleswaram, had to wait up to 10 hours to get their

"We were given the time as 5 pm and were asked to be here in advance at 3 pm. We have been here since then and even at 12 midnight, we are still waiting for our turn.' said Srikala, who flew in from Kochi on Saturday morning with her husband and daughter. According to her, at 12 am, close to 100 candidates were still waiting to get their documents verified.

Another parent said that authorities were not prepared to handle such a crowd. "People are coming from different states. They should know how many candidates they can see in one day. There is no provision for food and no proper toilet facilities. This does not happen with engineering counselling," he said

The document verification for candidates who qualified in the National Eligibilitycum-Entrance Test (NEET) began on Tuesday and concludes on July 19.

When contacted, the KEA officials said more than 3,000 candidates appeared for verification on Saturday. "We were able to finish by 9 or 9.15 pm in previous days. Today, the number of ranks posted for verification were more. We have to make sure that everyone completes the process today I as they have come from far," a KEA official told DH. The official added that they had adequate toilet facilities and a canteen so that candidates were not inconvenienced.

Council chief to meet AG over MLC fake travel bills row

BENGALURU: Legislative Council Chairman DH Shankaramurthy on Saturday said he will consult the Advocate General regarding the next course of action on a complaint that eight MLCs had claimed lakhs of rupees by submitting fake travel bills.

Shankaramurthy told reporters in Bengaluru that he will meet the Advocate General on Tuesday next to seek legal opinion on the issue.

BJP leader in the Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike Padmanabha Reddy had alleged that eight MLCs had claimed travel allowance from the Council secretariat by submitting fake bills.

Allum Veerabhadrappa, Raghu Achar, N S Boseraju, S Ravi, R B Thimmapura (all Congress), CR Manohar, Appajigowda (both JD-S) and M D Lakshminarayana (Independent) are the MLCs. Shankaramurthy said notices had been served on all the MLCs and replies received. He added that the MLCs in turn had submitted a petition to him seeking permission to move a privilege motion against Reddy. "I am examining their submission and will take a decision soon.' Shankaramurthy said there was no official communication about him being made governor of Telangana-Andhra Pradesh.

BENGALURU, DHNS: A petition has been submitted to the Vidhana Soudha police, seeking action against state BJP president B S Yeddyurappa for his "provocative' statement.

N Hanumegowda, a resident of Kamakshipalya has urged the police to take stern action against Yeddyurappa for his statement that Karnataka will be up in flames, if Kalladka Prabhakar Bhat was arrested. The police said as of now they treated Hanumegowda's petition as a representation and not a complaint. They said they would consult the legal department and act accordingly.

CEC favours cancellation of 20 iron ore mine leases in state

4 lease holders failed in R & R work, others didn't deposit guarantee money

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court-appointed Central **Empowered Committee** (CEC) has recommended action against 20 iron ore mining leases in Karnataka for their lapses in implementing reclamation and rehabilitation (R and R) work.

The CEC, in its report submitted to the court after inspecting R and R activities being executed by 'B' category mines in Ballari district, said, of the 20 mines, four lease holders failed to supply baseline data and other relevant material to prepare R and R plan. The state government can implement the R and R plans after treating these leases

as lapsed, the report said. "Despite the R and R plan being ready, the remaining 16 lease holders neither deposited the money nor it has been reey as specified by the CEC as a covered from them. The lessees may be directed to de-

posit the due amount within 30 days from the date of the order, failing which the government may take appropriate action for treating the leases as lapsed," said the report.

The panel suggested that Karnataka, Telangana and Surveyor General of India may be directed to file a report on the action taken for determination of inter-state boundary within the Ballari reserve forest.

Earlier, the court, which cancelled leases of all 'C' category mines, had directed the CEC to implement the R and R plan for 62 'B' category mines which committed less violation while extracting ore.

Of the 62 mines, Dehradunbased Indian Council of Forestry Research and Education prepared R and R plan for 58 mines and four leases holders failed to provide baseline data. The court had directed the companies to deposit mon-



The money will be returned to the lease holders on the satisfactory execution of the R and

R plan. Only 42 mines of the 58 lease holders have deposited Rs 103.12 crore as guarantee money with the CEC and started implementing the R and R

The Federation of Indian Mineral Industries had filed an interim petition before the Supreme Court, seeking return of the guarantee money to lease holders. Following this, the court asked the CEC to sub-

mit the status report on the im-

plementation of R and R plan.

Quota for Karnataka students in medical, dental seats to go up

BENGALURU, DHNS: Heeding to the demand of students, the state government has decided to increase the reservation for students of Karnataka domicile from 30% to 50% in the institution seats in private medical and dental colleges.

Private colleges hand over 40% of their seats to the government which are offered to students at a concessional fee. 16 lease holders who failed Management and Non-Resident Indian (NRI) seats make up another 20% of the seats. The remaining 40% seats are institution seats, which belong to the private colleges.

Earlier, of the 40% institution seats in colleges part of the Consortium of Medical Engineering and Dental Colleges of Karnataka (ComedK), 30% was reserved for students of Karnataka domicile. The remaining 70% seats were of open quota to be filled based on the All India Ranking in the NEET exam. Students from outside the state were also eligible for these seats.

However, only Karnataka students are eligible for seats in government colleges and government-quota seats in private institutions.

On Wednesday, the Karnataka Medical Students' and Youth Doctors' Association held a protest march in the city, saying

that the ratio was unfair to students from Karnataka. They had said that the government was allowing students from outside Karnataka to compete for seats here when other states have not opened up their colleges in a similar way. Members of the association met Medical Education Minister Dr Sharan Prakash Patil in Kalaburagi on Saturday and presented their demands.

Following this, a decision was made to revise the ratio. Now, only 50% of the institution seats are in the open quota. "There was a demand from students, so we decided to change the ratio. We have discussed it with the consortium and we have convinced them as well. Some changes will have to be made in the agreement and it is in the process," the minister said.

The association, however, still has other demands that it wants to raise and has called for a peaceful demonstration on Monday in front of the office of the Karnataka Examinations Authority in Malleswaram. "We want it to give more seats for students of Karnataka in the minority institutions as well. We have some other demands too. which our team is discussing. You can expect a huge gathering of students on Monday," said Dr Bharat Kumar, president of the association.
