Fathima Layout residents lose sleep over rainwater

BENGALURU: Residents of Fathima Layout and Defence Lavout in Thanisandra, North Bengaluru, have been waking up with rainwater gushing into their homes for the past 20 days. This has been happening for many years now.

The Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike (BBMP) has done little to address the problem. "For the past 20 vears, we have been facing a lot of problems during the rainy season. The authorities have been of no help. We complain to the BBMP every year, but nothing has done, Prabhakar, a resident, said.

No help from BBMP

With no help coming from the BBMP, residents took it problem by paying out of their own pocket.

Imtiyaz Ahmad, of Fathima Layout, said: "Last year, we pooled some money, got an earthmover and cleaned DH News Service

tions which violate admission procedures.

The case is from the 2015 admission year when a student who had got admission through Common Entrance Test in BIT wanted to surrender her seat, but was forced to pay the entire course fee of Rs 68,580.

"The student got admission in a medical college. So, she wanted to give up her engineering seat. The college, however, refused to return her original documents till she paid the fee for the remaining three years,' a source in the committee said. As the student was surrendering after the last date, the college was not required to refund the amount paid for the first year. However, they were not entitled to collect fee for the

remaining three years. Out of desperation to retrieve the documents, the parents paid the amount demanded by the college. Later, they made a complaint with the committee. The then chairman issued a notice to the college, but the case was forgotten when his term ended.

'No response'

Present chairman, retired judge Justice Anand Byrareddy took up the case again. "I issued a notice to the college, asking them to refund the fee with interest. There was no response from them. Later, they said the person delegated to respond had not done so. They tried to justify charging extra fee despite regulations against it," he said.

Regulations of the UniversityGrantsCommission(UGC) say colleges are not allowed to withhold original documents of students or force them to pay the entire course fee. Earlier this month, Justice

Byrareddy submitted a report to the government, recommending that the college be asked to pay double the collected fee, along with an interest of 18% per annum.
