Fuse Creativity Center

How does die-cut and letterpress in one pass sound? The Fuse Creativity Center by Fiskars does just that. It can die-cut, emboss, and letterpress in one pass through the machine. Its intuitive plating system only requires the essential components: one cutting plate and one rubber mat. And each design set (one cutting die and two letterpress plates) comes with a customized stackable lid (labeled on the top and side) for easy storage and identification. The starter set includes the machine, one design set, one ink pad, a cutting plate with rubber mat, and a base plate. Additional design sets can be purchased separately. Another bonus feature... the Fuse Adapter Kit (sold separately) contains the cutting bases and instructions for using competitors' dies.

Using the Fuse Creativity Center, I created these fall-themed tags to showcase the tool's three main features. First, I die-cut a tag from cardstock. Then, I die-cut and embossed a tag with one pass. Finally, I die-cut, embossed, and letterpressed a tag with one simple pass. Easy-peasy!

Creating Magic with Markers

Who knew you could do so many cool things with markers? We asked Go-to Gal Jennifer McGuire to come up with six different techniques using Tim Holtz's new Distress Markers (see p. 18 for more information). The result? Six terrific tags that use markers in a bold, new way.



Stamp with a white distress marker on dark cardstock.



Watercolor with markers. Scribble on plastic, add water, and pick up with brush-like watercolor.



Blending! Color with light, add dark, and then go back and blend with light.



Water blended background. Wet watercolor paper, scribble areas of color, and mist more. Let colors blend.



Stamp with distress markers. Color the rubber portion of the stamp, huff, and stamp.



Watercolor stamping. Color the rubber portion of the stamp, mist several times, stamp on watercolor paper, and let dry.
