#### 5. Emma González

In the United States, mass shootings have become a tragedy that occurs all too often.Emma González, a survivor of the Stoneman Douglas High School shooting, one of the deadliest school shooting in the history of the United States, recognized the horror of that fact and sought to change the future with the help of other survivors.

González has become an outspoken gun-reform young leader in the world since the tragedy at Stoneman Douglas, having directly spoken to U.S. politicians about reform. She even spoke at the March for Our Lives rally in 2018 to mass audiences on the subject of school shootings.

He is changing the narrative of saving cancer patients and engaging the government and other stakeholders in establishing a National Agency on Cancer Control to assist cancer victims in the country.

## 7. Henry Obinugwu, Founder, VNTS

Henry is a Tech Entrepreneur with broad interests in Hardware or Software Product Ideation, Design, Development and Manufacturing. Henry founded VNTS as a product development company invested in the ideation, development and production of original hardware products and the accompanying platforms supporting the devices. It is an indigenous organization founded on the premise that Africa is capable of manufacturing intelligent and innovative products tailored to solving Africa's peculiar tech needs.

## 8. lyinoluwa Abodeji

His plans for Nigeria's tech scene crystallised in 2014 when he combined forces with his old friend Jeremy Johnson, to establish lagos-based talent accelerator Andela, which recruits and trains software developers and connects them with employers. So far, Andela has trained more than 200 engineers since 2016. It also runs another campus in Nairobi, the capital of Kenya.

In 2016, the start-up raised \$24 million in funding from Facebook founder Zuckerberg. That same year, after helping to build the company to over \$100 million market cap in two years, lyinoluwa left Andela to start Flutterwave, a provider of technology and infrastructure solutions for digital payments across Africa. Today, the company processes over \$760 million through 7.5 million transactions for merchants in partnership with financial institutions.

## 9. Mark Elliot Zuckerberg

A social media magnate, internet entrepreneur, and philanthropist. He is known for co-founding the social media website Facebook and its parent company Meta Platforms, of which he is the chairman, chief executive officer, and controlling shareholder
