Shape: Round, oval, or hyper-angular, possibly with laser-cut end pieces and temples Material: Plastic, a mixture of materials Colors: Bright or pastel; pink, blue, purple; may feature floral, paisley, or geometric designs

"If there's fun to be had, I'm likely to be leading the charge, but don't mistake my free-spirited nature for lack of responsibility. Dress me up in a blazer and scarf and hand me an espresso, and I'm all over your professional photo shoot tomorrow morning."

Timeless with an Artistic Flair

Shape: Vintage or retro

Material: Plastic or metal Colors: Tortoiseshell, black, silver

What your glasses say:

"I'll be ready for an evening of cocktails followed by a film noir festival at the local art cinema as soon as I put the finishing touches on my latest novel, photography exhibit, or watercolor painting."

Confident and Secure, with a Little Extra

Shape: Something with smooth lines and subtle angles Material: Metal or plastic Colors: Earth tones, shiny bronze, copper, rust

What your glasses say:

"I may be getting older, but that doesn't mean I've lost touch with my inner child. Work-life balance isn't a chore; it's a reward. Just watch me hold my own in the boardroom, then head out to referee the kids' soccer match."

High Function, High Action

Shape: Wraparound or practically angular Material: Plastic or a combination of plastic and metal Colors: Silver, neon, bright red, bright blue

What your glasses say:

"I may work hard during the week, but when the weekend gets here, I'm going to be climbing mountains, sailing, skiing, biking, or something else epic, because life is too short to stay inside and miss the adventure."
