Riding is not a sport for the fickle or the fearful. Becoming a skilled rider requires passion, dedication and bravery. It is far from easy.

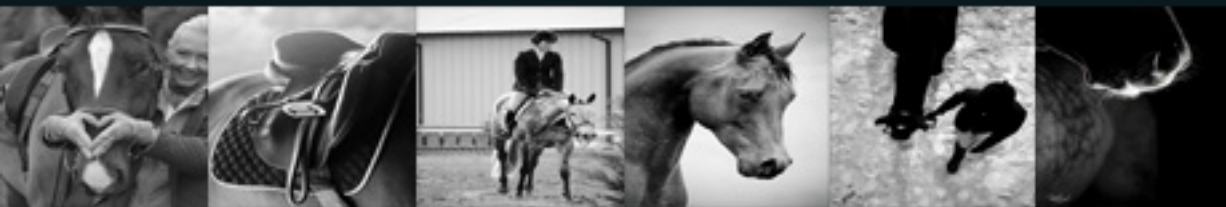
But we at Ablingette like to say that if our equestrians wanted to do something simple, they would have become runners. If they wanted something safe,

If you have the passion, we can give you the skills. If you have the courage, we can give you the reins.



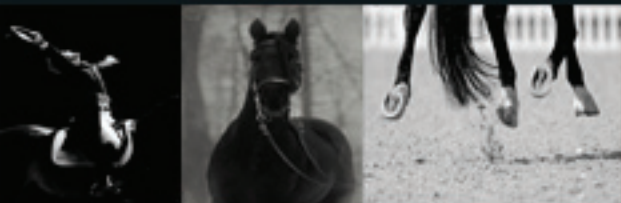
Our Training Methods

We follow traditional European training methods that have been passed down by dressage masters from the 1700's to today.

As an Ablingette student, you'll start your training on a lunge line, with your trainer leading your horse as you learn to balance at the walk, trot and canter. You'll soon feel as comfortable on your horse as you do in a chair--whether you are sitting, standing or perching with one foot in the stirrup and the other hanging off your horse's side.

Once your balance is strong, you'll graduate to guiding your own horse with reins. From there, you'll learn to become a team with your mount, communicating with each other almost invisibly and working together to build your horse's athleticism.

Having mastered balance and communication, you can specialize. The options are myriad: you can vault, jump, ride dressage, event or train for endurance racing. As we say at Ablingette, it's your chance to choose your own adventure.
