

Best Chew Toys For Rottweilers

Rottweilers are very energetic dogs. They are very intelligent and can get bored if they are not being physically and mentally challenged. Because of this, they require regular exercise to control their high energy levels and to push their endurance. The old adage that a Rottweiler just needs to have a large backyard so it can go outside for some exercise, doesn't apply anymore. Especially since they can't create their own work out programs. So it is up to you to make sure their bodies are moving. If their exercise needs are not being met daily, you will have a large dog filled with stored and unused energy on your hands.

This can lead to behavioral issues like excessive chewing. The kind of chewing that may lead to your entire living room or favorite pair of shoes being eaten. It is not uncommon for Rottweilers to have chewing desires. Rottweiler chew toys are a great way for them to keep their teeth clean, freshen their doggy breath, keep them mentally preoccupied, and for adolescents, to relieve the pain and itchy gums associated with the teething process.

But the trick really comes in finding the best toys for Rottweilers. These are not just your regular ordinary dogs. Rotties are members of the Mastiff family, and can reach weights in excess of 130lbs or more. Accompanying all of this mass is great muscular power and force, with extremely powerful jaws. A bored Rottweiler can be extremely destructive to your personal property.

Rottweiler toys can be used to curtail some of this stored energy. But before you go and rush out looking for the best toys for Rottweilers, there are a few things that must be considered, in order to make the best decision for you and your pet's need. For an example, giving a Rottweiler a traditional animal bone would take it less than an hour to demolish.

There are plenty Rottweiler toys in the marketplace. Some of the most common toys are made from hard rubber or rawhide. But with rawhide be sure to check with your dog's veterinarian about the safest types of rawhide.

You can break up the different types of toys into groups; activity toys, distraction toys, and comfort toys.

Activity toys like rubber bouncy types and knotted ropes can be used for chewing and tug-of-war. However, when using the knotted rope, be sure to supervise your Rottweiler, as they can be chewed into shredded pieces. Toys like ropes and tennis balls have been known to cause bowel obstructions.

Distraction toys are tailored to keep your pet entertained for hours. They can be filled with treats or peanut butter to keep a Rottweiler busy trying to extract the goodies from inside of the toy.

Comfort toys are usually softer stuffy toys made for lounging and relaxing. But generally aren't a good choice for a Rottweiler, since they can be easily ripped apart to reveal the stuffing inside of them.

Purchasing the right product for the job, being involved, and keeping a closer eye on your Rottie while they are playing with toys can help prevent these instances from happening. But looking for the best chew toys for Rottweilers should always start by finding toys that will stand up to their massive teeth and jaws.

KONG EXTREME X-LARGE

The Kong Extreme X-Large is designed with the strongest type of rubber offered by the Kong brand.

This toy is tailor made for heavy chewers and large breeds like the Rottweiler, and can be stuffed with bits of kibble or peanut butter to add some extra motivation. Like its predecessors, the Kong Extreme's offers an awkward shape that is designed to create erratic bounce movements that will keep your Rottweiler busy trying to keep up with its movements, while attempting to get at the morsels of food inside of the toy.

DODODO DOG ROPE WITH TUG

The Dododo Dog Rope is a large tug and chew toy designed for larger breeds of dog.

This tug rope's primary purpose is for playing tug-of-war with your Rottweiler and gnawing for teething purposes. The tug loop makes it easy for you to grab on to, while your pet grabs the knot on the other end of the rope.

PROS

Sturdy cotton
Machine washable
Non-Toxic

CONS

Shreds easily
Limited use
Requires constant supervision

NYLABONE BIG CHEW

The Nylabone Big Chew is made for dogs weighing 50 pounds or larger, and is also meant to strengthen your dog's oral health.
