The Connors Center is a national leader and change agent in women's health. Its work has advanced groundbreaking discovery in sex- and gender-based biology, and Connors Center advocacy continues to influence national policy related to how research is conducted and applied to women's healthcare. While significant progress has been made in women's health research during the past decade, in part due to the Connors Center's leadership, how diseases and drugs impact women and men differently is still unknown for the vast majority of medical conditions. The Connors Center's work is focused on actively changing this paradigm to achieve parity in women's health.
