Primarily, if you look closely into the formulation of the RV toilet paper, you will understand that it is created with essential features matching the sewer system's capacity.

For starters, it is fast dissolving which prevents clogging. And as many RV travelers would tell you, the last thing you want to do involving the toilet is manually filtering and cleaning the sewer tank because of congested toilet paper.

# What's the Difference Between RV Toilet Paper & Regular Toilet Paper?

The primary difference between RV toilet paper and regular toilet paper lies in the varied materials they are made of.

Sure, both types of toilet paper share standard components such as bits of fibers, hardwood, and softwood. But RV toilet papers have different manufacturing standards that correspond to the sensitivity of the RV toilet sewage system.

Simply put, with RV toilet paper, you can flush it without the risk of clogging the toilet or causing unspeakable damage to the black tank.

On the other hand, residential toilet papers are thicker and dissolve slower than their RV counterpart.

A household type of toilet paper is designed with strength and softness in mind. Although these two attributes seem to be contrasting, manufacturers have found the right materials and protocol to produce the optimum toilet paper.

Hence, some brands with strong and thick toilet paper are naturally hard to dissolve in water. So naturally, these two qualities often become the foundation of brand marketing.

## Why Should You Choose RV Toilet Paper Over a Regular Toilet Paper?

There's no doubt that RV toilet paper should be preferred over regular toilet paper when you're on a recreational vehicle. But if you're still in doubt, check out the following attributes of an RV toilet that makes it suitable for the mini bathroom aboard the RV.

### Dissolvability

This is by far the most sensible reason why you should use RV toilet paper when relieving yourself in an RV toilet. But you may wonder why.

The rapid ability of this type of toilet paper to dissolve is one of the reasons why you don't experience toilet clogs on the road. An RV toilet paper will quickly disintegrate before accumulating in the sewer system.

Unlike regular toilet paper, which is made of multiple sheets of paper, RV toilet paper is made of paper clumps fused together.

Once the paper touches the water, you can really see the chunks break apart. This is very critical as the black tank that collects the wastewater and whatnot is relatively smaller. Therefore, the volume decreases if the toilet paper is deposited in fine pieces.

Additionally, the RV is constantly moving. Hence, you could be rocking the tank constantly. However, if it is filled with intact toilet paper and waste, it could be one shake away from disaster. That's why RV toilet paper is generally regarded as septic safe.

On the flip side, regular toilet paper takes longer to dissolve primarily because it is formulated to ensure that it is strong enough. In addition, many layers are usually pressed together so that water won't be able to penetrate and break easily. Therefore, it could block the tank faster.

### How Long Does It Take for RV Toilet Paper to Dissolve?

A piece of RV toilet paper can dissolve four times longer than residential ones. On average, it could take about 3 to 5 minutes for the RV toilet paper to disintegrate. Some brands have their toilet paper break apart for even less than a minute.

### Biodegradability

Dissolvability often goes hand-in-hand with biodegradability. In fact, it is not uncommon to find both terms used interchangeably.

However, there are critical differences between the two. If we're talking about the rate of solubility, naturally, we are referring to dissolvability. This includes water as the solvent that dissolves the material almost 100% of the time.

On the other hand, biodegradability involves the work of microorganisms breaking down the material.

Toilet papers, in general, are biodegradable as they are made of wood fibers. But some brands decompose faster than others.

In an RV situation, biodegradability plays a role in the continuous breakdown of toilet paper in the sewer tank. As one of your goals is to reduce clumpy or bulky wastes or materials, choosing a highly biodegradable RV toilet paper is beneficial.

### Softness

Despite the apparent need for RV toilet paper to dissolve fast, it is still hard to sacrifice the comfort and softness you get from regular toilet paper.

However, you may not know it, but RV toilet paper can still be soft and fast dissolving at the same time.

A pivotal choice to achieve this texture lies in your choice of ply. It is recommended to get a 2-ply RV toilet paper instead of 1. Most 2-ply toilet papers are non-scratchy with softness that could cradle your bottom.

Nonetheless, some RV enthusiasts still pack 1-ply toilet paper because they assume that it's going to dissolve faster. While there may be some truth to this claim, you will probably need more sheets when you use 1-ply toilet paper. As a result, you're using instead of saving more papers.

## What Happens if You Use a Regular Toilet Paper Instead of an RV Toilet Paper?

If you prefer using residential toilet paper over RV toilet paper, you might experience problems in your black tank or sewer tank.

Since regular toilet papers dissolve rather slowly than their RV counterpart, the likelihood of these sheets balling up and accumulating in the tank is absolutely high.

Nevertheless, you can still use regular toilet paper in the bathroom, provided that you don't flush it in the toilet.

You can properly dispose of the used toilet paper in the bin and discard the wastes in designated areas within your travel.
