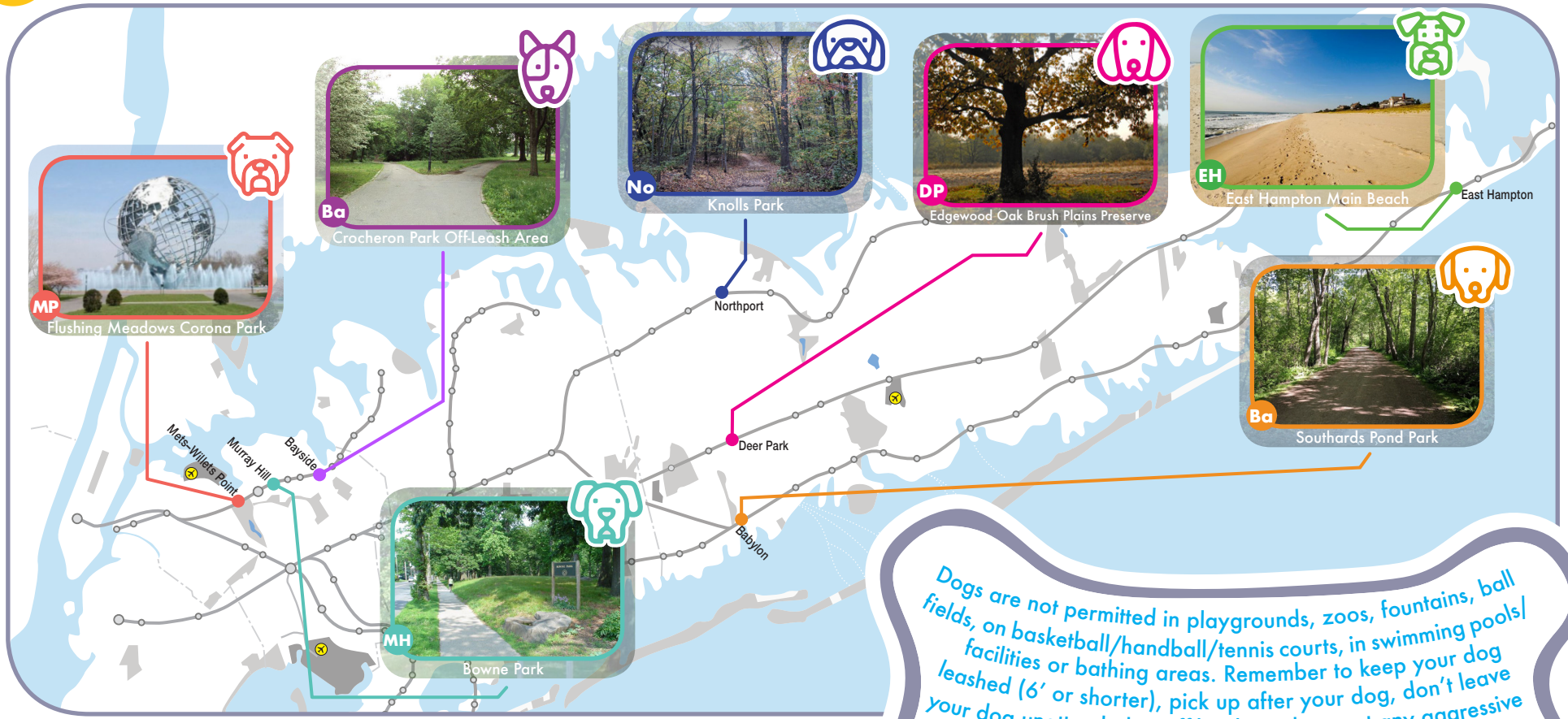


My Dog Parks Near Modernized LIRR Stations

*Seeing eye and hearing dogs are permitted on all LIRR trains and in all LIRR stations.
 *Small domestic pets are permitted provided they are carried in kennels or similar containers that can be accommodated by you on your lap without annoyance to other passengers. No part of the animal may protrude from the container, and pets should not occupy seats.

Dogs are not permitted in playgrounds, zoos, fountains, ball fields, on basketball/handball/tennis courts, in swimming pools/facilities or bathing areas. Remember to keep your dog leashed (6' or shorter), pick up after your dog, don't leave your dog unattended or off-leash, and correct any aggressive behavior.

Station-Park Info

EH East Hampton Station
East Hampton Main Beach Dogs are welcome off-leash on this white sand beach anytime in the off-season. Bring a frisbee, your pal's favorite tennis ball... whatever you need to get them racing into the Atlantic

MP Mets-Willets Point Station
Flushing Meadows Corona Park was home to two World's Fairs. The largest park in Queens, there's plenty of room for you

and your canine companion to roam here. You'll find the Under-bridge Playground Dog Run at 64th Ave/64th Rd. and the Grand Central Parkway service road, for the perfect off-leash frolic.

No Northport Station
 A leafy hideaway in Huntington accessible by foot from the renovated Northport Station, Veterans Park and **Knolls County Park** are perfect for picnicking or hiking with your furry bestie.

MH Murray Hill Station
Bowne Park, in Flushing, is bounded by 29th and 32nd Avenues and 155th and 159th Streets. The park boasts a bocce court, modern playground equipment, basketball courts and beautiful bench-lined walkways.

DP Deer Park Station
Edgewood Oak Brush Plains Preserve, includes the Edgewood Blue Hiking Trail, a 2.7-mile loop through a pine barren forest. The preserve is home to warblers, red-tailed hawks, eastern cottontail and red fox.

Ba Babylon Station
Southards Pond Park's nature paths diverge in its woods, and you and your dog can travel all of them, over streams, through

tunnels...this is a park that invites you to explore its 19 forested, uncrowded acres.

Ba Bayside Station
 If you and your best friend love trees, here's your chance to wander among catalpas, elms, sycamore maples, red oaks and weeping willows. There's also a dog run at **Crocheron Park**, so you can let your buddy off the leash, for a little romp and roll.
