


## Proenza Schouler

Proenza managed to be the talk the town this season, thanks to Jack McCollough and Lazaro Hernandez abstract prints and tribal textures. There was so much attention to detail in this collection, with a red and black hard-hitting color scheme and the experimenting in mixing textures. The show illustrated a stunning success of tribal designs in bold and daring prints with masses of texture with, fur-trimmed chiffons, slashed viscose knits, feathers, sequins and shredded shoes. The red and black mixture was a striking color combination and the collection had a soft touch of the pale grey.








## Marc Jacobs

Marc Jacobs' closed NYFW AW15 where he showcased Victorian glamour, with prints in shimmering snakeprint and gothic hues – sturdy greys, blood reds, dark metallics and de-saturated raspberry, with black lace floor length skirts, floral full skirts that can be traced back to the 1940s, sheer tulle peeking beneath tunics, over-elbow gloves, with a touch of the emerging 70s trend, and Peter Pan collars and vnecked tank tops. There were bondage elements with straps across body and thigh-high leather boots (we predict these will be a big trend next season). Marc Jacobs' real standout was the shimmer – the sequins, jewels and embellishment which adorned everything on the catwalk.
