
Would you like a private room?

hanks to your gifts and the gifts of hundreds of others, private patient rooms will soon become the norm on our Petoskev Campus. The renovation project will build 92 new private patient rooms and will convert our existing rooms into private rooms, giving patients a peaceful, calm environment to heal.

Private rooms eliminate noise and interruptions from roommates, their visitors, and caregivers. For the loved ones visiting a patient, private rooms provide more space for them and improved communication between patients, families, and caregivers.

"One of the most common requests we receive from patients is that they want a private room," said Jennifer Woods, Interim CEO of McLaren Northern Michigan. "Research shows that environmental factors are very important to patient healing. We believe the rooms will have many benefits for patients, their loved ones, and our care teams."

Planned Giving: Beneficiary Giving is Simple

Making a gift through a beneficiary designation is a straightforward way to have a lasting impact.

id you know that you can plan a future gift to the McLaren Northern Michigan Foundation without changing your will or parting with any of your assets during your lifetime?

One of the easiest gifts you can make is to name McLaren Northern Michigan Foundation as a beneficiary to one of the following assets:

IRAs and Other Qualified Retirement Plan Designations:

Designate McLaren Northern Michigan Foundation as the ultimate or partial beneficiary of a retirement account such as the beneficiary of a retirement account such as an IRA or 401(k). If you're considering a gift in your will, retirement funds are a good option as these are heavily taxed when left to heirs.

Life Insurance: Name McLaren Northern Michigan Foundation as a beneficiary of an existing life insurance policy if your family no longer needs the benefits; designate all or a portion of the policy benefit.

Payable on Death (POD) and Transfer on Death (TOD)

Accounts: A POD or TOD account allows for the money remaining in a bank or investment account to go directly to the beneficiaries named when the account owner passes. Simply instruct your account administrator where to distribute your account balance.

Donor-Advised Fund Designations: Recommend that at the end of your lifetime a lump-sum grant be made from your donor-advised fund account to a charity. Check your donor-advised fund's policies and guidelines to confirm.

These options allow you to give while providing you with peace of mind that you'll have access to your assets if they are needed.





Project Update







Construction continues even in the northern Michigan winter!

Here's a brief look at what your gifts have already made possible.

- State of Michigan Certificate of Need: The CON was approved on schedule as expected in the fall.
- Excavation: Harbor Springs Excavating has moved more than 20,000 square yards of soil in order to dig the basement.
- **Earth Retention System (ERS):** A temporary wall is being built to encase the entire site. The wall will take five to six weeks to complete and will extend 40 feet down into the ground.
- Concrete Foundations: Once the basement digging is complete, concrete foundations will be poured through June.
- Structural Steel Fabrication: Steel beams are currently being fabricated for construction and will be delivered and erected in July.
- Cath Lab Renovations: Creation of a new Transesophageal Echocardiography room is underway and will be completed in early March.
