Title: PARCHED

Logline:

A first-time college freshman must overcome her fear of water, or succumb to the pressure of fitting in and making new friends, or else it may just cost her, her life.

Synopsis:

This is Giselle's first time in college. She is nervous about making new friends and worries that her not knowing how to swim will have an impact on her ability to connect with her class. Despite her doubts, her mom reassures her that she will be fine and they embark on a three-day road trip from California to Washington, D.C. Treatment:

We see a montage of Giselle's move-in day from her starting the 3-day long road trip to her making it to her new dorm and taking in her new home and space. She says bye to her mom, who is staying in a nearby hotel. Rather than continue to unpack and decorate her dorm, Giselle is eager is go out and meet new people.

She attends and freshman mixer and is quick to find her "group." The group of eight spends time talking about their hobbies and what brought them to where they are. The mixer dies

down so the group decides to hang out in a lounge. Three of them went to high school together and grew up in the area. They talk about things to do in the area and one of them, Kyle, brings up a haunted waterpark.
