NATIONALLY, SCHOLARSHIPS SOLVE THESE REALITIES:

College costs are rising faster than the average family income.

Students from low-income families average \$10,000 of unmet need for college annually.

Many college students must work more than 20 hours a week.

Working students miss out on extra-curricular activities.

Students are forced to take the higher paying part-time job over those providing career-related experience.

Financial stress and fatigue impair academic performance.

We must do more.

Marian University is proud to provide some level of financial assistance for 99 percent of its students, but many would benefit from additional support. Even students who are fortunate enough to be awarded academic, athletic, or other program scholarships are often not able to cover their full tuition or have other remaining expenses, such as room and board, required books and class supplies, transportation, appropriate seasonal outerwear and spirit wear.

SCHOLARSHIPS ARE SUSTAINABLE.

Named scholarships at Marian are invested through our endowment. This allows funds to be awarded annually in perpetuity and provides an investment in Marian's long-term success and financial health.

Why create an endowment?

- Endowments are legacies of generosity. By creating an endowed scholarship at Marian University, you receive the opportunity to honor a loved one, valued colleague, or mentor.
- The scholarships you support through our endowment are a reliable source of funding as we plan to accommodate current and future students.

How does an endowed scholarship work?

- A minimum of \$50,000 must be reached before an endowed scholarship can be awarded.
- That funding may come from one donor or from many donors who join forces to create the scholarship through contributions all at once, or over time.
- Endowed scholarships funded at \$50,000 before June 30 in a fiscal year will be awarded at the start of the following academic year (e.g. funded by June 30, 2022, awarded to a student for 2023-24).


Private Scholarships

If an endowed scholarship is not possible for you or if you are in the process of funding an endowed scholarship but would like to have a scholarship awarded before the \$50,000 minimum is reached private scholarships can be established at \$2,000, with a commitment of at least two years.

Donors who establish private scholarships also provide the name and criteria for the award.

Private scholarship contributions must be received before February 15 in a calendar year to be awarded for the following fall semester (e.g. payment and criteria established by February 1, 2022, will be awarded for the 2022-23 academic year).
