





A new Italy-focused escorted tour operator is delving deep into the country's culinary and spiritual soul, discovers India-Jayne Trainor

'm in the hotel kitchen, rolling minced pork and sultanas into tiny balls and pressing them into yellow, hand-stretched handkerchiefs of pasta, before folding them into misshapen bundles.

Our efforts are overseen by Giampiero, whose family own and run the Miramonti Hotel & Spa in the small town of Rota d'Imagna. With his wife, Olga, he deftly creates dozens of neat little casoncelli, a traditional Bergamasque pasta, which are then tossed in butter and pancetta ready for us to eat.

This is just the start of our Essence of Lombardy trip, an itinerary created by new trade-only escorted tour operator Magari Tours. The brand was introduced earlier this year by Kent-based Albatross Group to offer a selection of small-group tours across Italy – including Tuscany, Puglia and Umbria – that focus on deeply local experiences. Trips hop around hidden churches, rustic trattorias and countryside vineyards that offer an insight into authentic Italian life, and

feature family-run accommodation and businesses that support local communities.

IMAGNA VALLEY

To the east of Lake Como is the Imagna Valley, where rolling hills and tiny towns are set against the dramatic backdrop of the snow-capped Bergamasque Prealps. Sliding open the balcony doors of my room on our first day, I spy clouds swirling over the distant hills. We venture there by coach in search of the Cornabusa Sanctuary, a spiritual refuge inside a cave. Led by our friendly and knowledgeable guide, Wendy (who speaks fluent Italian and seems to know every Lombardian we meet), we learn about the history of the sanctuary.

Pulling ourselves away from the panoramic views over the valley below, we're treated to a variety of speciality cheeses, honey and chutneys by local restaurant managers Davide and Simona.

Advise any clients who travel with Magari Tours to pack clothes with a stretchy waistband, thanks to the wonderful culinary experiences on offer. Antica Locanda Roncaglia, a village trattoria in the hills with mountain views, is just one of many, where owner Sara serves up four courses of regional recipes, including wild herb risotto, pork with polenta and homemade pasta. It's followed by some traditional *Elisir de Còrt*, a strong local liqueur made from hay by one of our hotel's staff, which quickly sends us to sleep.

BERGAMO AND BEYOND

After unwinding in the Miramonti's indoor-outdoor pool and spa, the next morning it's time for some more adventure.

Our 40-minute drive to Bergamo is filled with snippets of local insights from Wendy. The ancient city sits high on a hill, surrounded by Unesco-listed walled fortifications and filled with ornate churches and cobbled streets. We're led around the Città Alta (Upper Town) by another guide, Elena, who shares fascinating details about every church, piazza and museum we pass. Although time is short on our taster fam trip, the full version of this tour also includes the colourful city of Brescia, which is scattered with Roman ruins.

Our next stop is Castello di Grumello, an ancient wine-growing estate that overlooks the sloping vineyards in Valcalepio. We enjoy a tour of the wine cellar before our trio of tastings, paired with breads, meats and cheeses.

We get a welcome chance to stretch our legs just a stone's throw away at Lake Iseo. Surrounded by mountains, the medieval villages along the shoreline are best seen from the water on a scenic boat trip, which is included in the itinerary.

The journey includes a final local experience at Cascina Carretto, a working farm and wine estate. After strolling among the vines and peeking into the sparkling wine cellar, we are served a five-course lunch, all made from home-grown ingredients. By the time we depart, the restaurant is brimming with local families chatting over their glasses of franciacorta wine – a true taste of Italy.
