Activist Highlight

Marsha P. Johnson



Marsha was one of the first activists to publicly fight for transgender rights, helped lead the Stonewall riots and was a central figure in the LGBTQ movement. She co-founded Street Transvestite Action Revolutionaries with her fellow activist Sylvia Rivera and opened the first house to shelter homeless LGBTQ youth.
