Differentiating Instruction to Accommodate Learning Styles: Lesson Plan Template

Introduction

Technology has proven a valuable asset when planning lessons. With the expectation of differentiated instruction, teachers have found that technology can often offer ways to accommodate lessons and even enhance lesson plans. I will ask them to go on their computer and find their favorite old child song, listen to the rhythm, then try to complete a rhythm similar to their favorite. Once they feel they have conquered their rhythm, they will begin to form claps, stomps, or slaps to their beat.

How will you assess student work?

I will have them tell me their inspirational song, then I will have them play me their beat, after I hear the beat, I will have them demonstrate their claps and other dancing mechanisms. If I feel the student has put hard work into their musical creation, I will provide them with a good grade.

Hearing Impaired- Students will receive headphones to be able to better their hearing. Students who are completely deaf with getting drums to help feel vibrations. They can create any beat they'd like, with no clapping involved.

ADHD- Students will be given a specific space marked with painter's tape, where they can utilize their space to dance and move around as much as they'd like.
