According to the CDC up to 1 in 4 of adults in the United States has a disability. With 7.2% (23,896,800) having an independent living disability.

Vita Living is an amazing non profit organization that specializes in care for adults with learning and developmental disabilities. Their clients are Houston's most vulnerable citizens who can't care for themselves and need a lot of attention.

Vita Living offers three core programs: Residential which entails around the clock care and living arrangements for the client. Day programs where clients come in and participate in daily activities where they are taught social and life skills, and case management services, a process where a plan is mapped out for the development of clients.

Founded in 1982 by Renee and Stan Wallace as a solution for their disabled son Ricky who was turned away from other caregiving organizations, Vita Living has been serving the adult special needs community for 41 years with up to 20 group homes and 70 residents. Vita Living also provides nursing, clinical/behavioral services, and transportation to their clients.

Vita Living is a Houston based nonprofit organization whose mission is to provide support, care, and a home to adults with developmental issues. The organization works to fulfill (\$\$\$) to keep funding their programs, essential needs, and residential expansion.
