

TECHNIQUES: REVIEW OF SMART GOALS ACTIVITY

WHAT ARE SMART GOALS?

- Specific-define the goal for the class or topic being taught.
- Measurable- How will you measure that students met the goal and their success?
- Attainable- Are the goals differentiated for all students and can they be accomplished?
- Relevant- What are the results of the goal or learning?
- Time-Bound- How long will this goal take to master?
