Why do we need Pride?



We have come a long way since the very first Pride march 50 years ago. However there is still a long way to go:

- There are 69 countries that have laws that criminalise homosexuality.
- There are 9 countries where you be get the death penalty just for being LGBTQ+.
- Marriage equality is legal in only 31 out of 195 countries.

Government's Landmark LGBT+ Conference Cancelled After Conversion Therapy Ban Backlash

The UK government's international LGBT+ conference has been cancelled amid the row over [partially banning conversion therapy](#), multiple reports have suggested.

It comes after more than 100 organisations, including Stonewall, boycotted the landmark Safe To Be Me event, to be held in London in June, over plans to exclude trans people from the legislation.

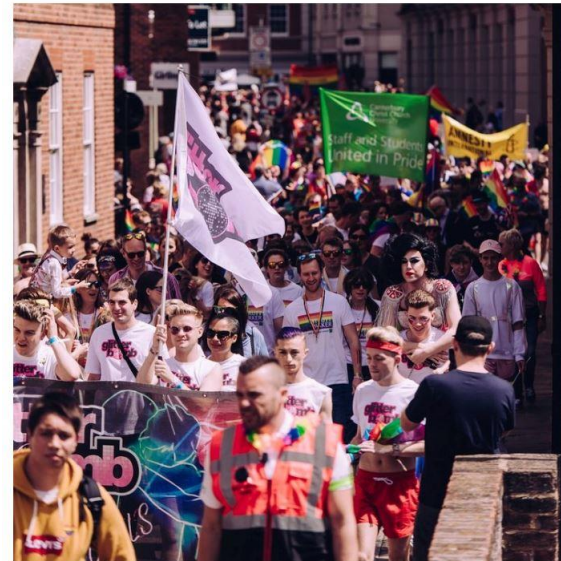
*The website only gives quantities of 10, 25, 50 or 100. There could be other options /negotiating when we have confirmed numbers.
