


Round 2: Connor Prielipp (Alabama) LHP

- Defensively moveable, ability to play SS,2B,3B and make utility role

- 91-94 mph Fastball to 96 with unusual angle
- Solid low 80's slider
- Strike thrower with 4 pitch mix (curve, Change up)

- Solid to plus runner with strong arm
- High average guy
- Has shown great eye at the plate

Round 6: Jorel Ortega (Tennessee) 2B/SS

6'0 | 194lbs

- Tommy John surgery 2020
- Quick hands and good hand eye coordination
- Defensively fits at 2B but could have arm for 3B.
- High OPS this past collegiate season

- Low 90s fastball, high spin curveball, tumbling change up
- Struggles with walks and throwing hittable fastball
- High strikeout guy (set school record)

Round 8: Zebby Matthews (Western Carolina) RHP

6'5 | 210lbs

- Low to mid 90s fastball, low 80s slider misses bats
- Big durable frame
- High strikeout stuff

Round 9: Cory Lewis (UC-Santa Barbara) RHP

6'5 | 220lbs

- High spin rate and great extension
- Low 90s fastball, change up, 11-5 curve, useable knuckleball
- Big durable pitcher with great make up

Round 10: Dalton Shuffield (Texas State) SS

- Sun Belt Player of the Year
- Good defensive shortstop
- Durable, played in all games
