### • Wooden Sickle - 'homely' - electric

A repurposed wooden ornamental sickle. While the batteries are starting to go, the queasy voices of the Red Army Band can still be heard through it's tacked-on speaker. (05% 'flinch' possibility)

## • Bronze Battle-axe - 'voiceless' - love

("The Vain Farewell") A decorated, yet sturdy, battle-axe. Ordained with coloured ribbon and encrusted jewels; this is a weapon for pure narcissists.

(x2 bonus damage when striking immediately after being hit)

### • <u>Composite Bow</u> – 'therapeutic' - darkness

A reserved, yet powerful, Composite bow. Although its walnut structure lends a menacing look, it's said that whoever wields it may feel the comforting breath of the Lord Mother on their cheek.

(1/4 HP damage inflicted, gained back)

# • (III)Tempered-Steel Broadsword – 'tough' – electric

A restless Pictish broadsword; clearly having seen the ravages time, and battle. To those of a more superstitious disposition, the face embedded in its cross guard may appear to alter its mood in accordance to the wielder's bloodlust.

 $(\pm I \text{ damage - up to } \pm 5 \text{ - after each consecutive, connecting strike})$ 

# • Tempered-Steel Headed Flail – 'thoughtful' – tsunami

A benthic, heavy-set steel flail. Like the oceanic currents, this weapon is designed with increasing force in mind — while its head may be heavy; you can't help but wonder, what could be on its mind..? (+5 water damage)

## • Steel Alloy Scythe - 'righteous' - fire

A righteous, deadly repurposed farming implement. While unassuming in its appearance, it's said that the souls of twenty-four thousand slain corrupted peoples lay within this blade's tempered edge. (+3 poison damage)

#### Recurve bow

With curved limbs, and able to fire a deadly projectile in skilled hands; this bow was once a common sight within the ranks of ancient armies. Now it's mostly used in sporting and recreational events.

#### Steel-Alloy Jó Staff

Reportedly forged after defeat from a roaming swordsman, the Jó Staff – perhaps intentionally – grants its user more reach than that of a traditional blade. Although traditionally made of wood, this particular variant is bestowed with a significant weight increase – alongside a devastating blow.

#### Copper Flail

While its original purpose was to separate grain; like most farming equipment, its military potential couldn't be ignored. Now it's best-known for its users separating life from their opponent's bodies; through momentum and brute force, of course!

#### Steel Halberd

Originally an inexpensive weapon to produce, its role has since been replaced by other, longer poled, blades. However, if someone charges at you with you while wielding one; perhaps don't waste your time reciting that to them!
