## Texas A&M University San Antonio Mandates Cultural Competency Training for Faculty and Staff

The university will begin to fully embrace the marginalized military community.

SAN ANTONIO, TX- Beginning Fall 2017, Texas A&M San Antonio (A&M-SA) will be mandating a cultural competency training for faculty and staff.

There has been a growing demand for higher education for service members and school officials believe that it is important for faculty and staff to be aware of the difficulties students with military connections face.

Faculty and staff at A&M-SA are strongly in favor of this new training. "Sometimes we forget that the military is another culture that needs to be included in 'multiculturalism'," said K.C Kalmbach, an associate professor of psychology at the university. For many who joined when they were 17, the military has as profound an effect on their identity and world view as their religion, race and home town."

This newly mandated training is another addition to the already "military embracing" university. A&M-SA has made obtaining a higher education easier for students with military connections by making credits easily transferable and having easily accessible classrooms for students with disabilities. There is even a veterans' center that gives both veterans, and even their service dogs a place to relax.

Students with military connections have expressed their appreciation for what A&M-SA has done for their community. "I was thrown into a world I didn't quite recognize," said Daniel Rendon about how he felt in the beginning of his collegiate career.
