# Drive Medical Hospital Bed Troubleshooting: Common Problems and How to Fix Them

It's normal for manual and electrical devices to develop some problems even with regular maintenance services. The Drive Medical hospital bed is no exception, be on the lookout for the following <u>issues</u>:

### **Remote Not Working**

Usually, your Drive Medical hospital bed stops working because the pendant has lost connection with the control box. This issue is easy to fix. First, press and hold two buttons on the pendant while pressing the reset button. You'll hear a unique tune if the synchronization is successful. If it's still not working, unplug the bed's electrical supply and detach the pendant control. Then, re-synchronize it according to the guidelines above.

## Drive Medical Hospital Bed Stuck In Up Position

Your bed's control pendant might be functioning normally, but the bed remains affixed in an upright position. This problem can result from several factors, including a malfunctioning motor. Below are some of the possible solutions:

- Inspect both bed ends to ensure that the Gear Box Crank connections are pointing outward, such that they are accessible to the hand crank.
- Inspect both bed-end gearboxes to ensure that the drive shaft is correctly attached.

### Noise When the Bed is Raising and Lowering

This issue has two possible causes. First, the bed's components, such as the headboard and the frame, might be rubbing against the mattress. Make an effort to detach them from the mattress if that's the case. Second, this issue may mean that your body weight plus the mattress weight may exceed the weight limit of the Drive Medical hospital bed. Get a lighter mattress or a bed with a stronger base, like a Drive Medical bariatric bed, to correct this issue.

### The Mattress Slips and Moves Excessively

Begin by ensuring that the mattress retention bar is in place and securely grips the mattress's front. Alternatively, look for some small fabric straps that you can use to secure the mattress. Make it less noticeable or conspicuous. If these options fail, get a new mattress that fits the bed.

#### Bed Decks Not Elevating

Check for proper installation of the pull tubes and that the spring button is securely locked into the outer tube.

#### The Bed Keeps Moving

This problem usually results from an unengaged floor lock, the caster lock pedal. To correct it, engage the lock by pushing it downwards. There might also be an obstruction between the casters and the floor, or the surface is just too slippery.

Correct this issue by removing the obstructions. You can also opt to keep the bed on a less slippery floor.

#### **Faulty Actuators**

The common cause of malfunctioning actuators is loose wire connections. The best solution is to inspect the wiring for loose connections and reconnect them. Then, replace those with permanent damages.

### **Slow Bed Movement**

Your bed is moving slowly because of an unplugged power cord and a faulty backup battery. Reconnect the power cable to the wall socket, and the bed should return to its usual operating speed. Alternatively, if you are using a backup battery, replace it.

# Ratcheting Noise from the Casters

Check whether the casters are locked. If so, unlock them by pushing down the left caster lock pedals and pulling up the right caster lock pedals.
