# Juniper Networks Awards Grant in Partnership with Greater Lowell Community Foundation Center for Business Philanthropy

The Juniper Networks Community Grant Program Awards \$10K Grant to the Clean River Project

WESTFORD, MA – Juniper Networks, which creates innovative technologies that help customers connect ideas and thrive in our ever-changing world, today announced that its Community Grant Program is awarding a \$10,000 grant through the Greater Lowell Community Foundation Center for Business Philanthropy. The program seeks to build relationships with nonprofit organizations and engages employees in learning about service opportunities in their communities in the Greater Lowell area.

The grant was awarded to the Lowell-based Clean River Project, a non-profit organization which seeks tirelessly to remove trash and debris from the Merrimack River in an effort to restore the river and its beaches to their former pristine state. Clean River Project will run an educational program for lower income youth this summer. This will be a hands-on program taking the students out on the river to conduct environmental studies, where they will learn about water quality, pollution, hazardous wastes and other contaminants, sonar technology, and the history of the Merrimack River.

"Here at the Greater Lowell Community Foundation, our mission has always been to improve the quality of life for the people in the communities we serve by connecting donors with nonprofits that serve the causes that matter to them," said Jay Linnehan, Executive Director of the Greater Lowell Community Foundation. "Working with Juniper Networks to bring philanthropy into the workplace in order to give back to their community has been a wonderful experience."

#### **The Grant Process**

From reading a grant proposal to learning about the organizations in the community and filtering through the worthy applications in order to select the finalists, and participating in onsite work sessions with the Greater Lowell Community Foundation, employees have the opportunity to learn how nonprofits are addressing important issues in the community. From 25 grant submissions, 3 finalists were selected and invited to Juniper Networks corporate headquarters to share how their organizations would best serve the community, how they would use the grant funds, and their ideas for employee community service projects. The grant of \$10,000 was awarded by Juniper Networks employees to Clean River Project, which will put those funds to good use removing tires from the Merrimack River in the Haverhill, MA area. Clean River Project will invite Juniper Networks employees to join them for a designated clean up on the river.
