- > Successful completion of an Honours Bachelor's degree, or equivalent, with a minimum average of 78% in English courses and 75% overall
- > 3 references
- > Statement of interest

MA program study options

> THESIS

Students in the Thesis option complete 4 courses and a thesis which is typically 80-100 pages in length.

> RESEARCH PAPER

Students enrolled in the Research Paper option complete 6 courses and a Master's Research Paper which is typically 40-50 pages in length.

> COURSEWORK

Students in the coursework option complete 8 courses. No research paper or thesis is required.
