2025 Lincoln Navigator Revealed: What You Need to Know

Three years after its 2022 update, the Lincoln Navigator gets an update for 2025. Numerous prototypes had been spotted in recent months, and video updates from Lincoln showed an illuminated Lincoln badge and light-up bars in the grille. These appear to be the most prominent design changes from previous model years. Still on the exterior, the range-topping SUV from Lincoln now has Nautilus-inspired styling, which entered its second generation in 2024 with a fresh look and improved interior quality as the major updates. Basically, the 2024 Lincoln Nautilus was luxurious like never before, and now that the new Lincoln Navigator is here, we expect it to be the same or even better. However, it remains unchanged under the hood, with a 3.5-liter twin-turbocharged V6 making 440 horsepower and 510 lb.ft standard across all models. What specific upgrades can we expect to see in the 2025 Lincoln Navigator? Here's what we know.

Lighting Up The Front Fascia Must Be The New Trend

Visually, the 2025 Lincoln Navigator retains most of its core design cues, such as the sloping roofline, adding a few contemporary elements here and there. The illuminated Lincoln badge and light-up bars in the grille are the only notable design changes heavily borrowed from the Lincoln Nautilus front fascia. It seems that lighting up the front end is the new trend, with Cadillac doing something similar on the 2025 Escalade, borrowing grille lighting technology from its EV lineup. However, while the Escalade has a more muscular look, the 2025 Lincoln Navigator takes a more refined approach, offering luxury and grace in its design. There are also updated headlights and taillights to go with the new design. New wheel and exterior paint options are also part of the 2025 refresh, going up to 24-inch radiant copper aluminum wheels with a bright machine finish. For paint, eight options are available, including three tri-coat options: Pristine While Metallic, Crystal White Metallic and Gray Mist.

The 2025 Lincoln Navigator, like all Navigators before it, is expected to have a huge and luxurious cabin.

Based on the teaser clips and the recent videos and photos released by Lincoln, it's clear that the interior of the 2025 Navigator draws inspiration from the Lincoln Nautilus, like the exterior. One majorly noticeable update is the rotary knob on the center console, now featuring a diamond-style glass ring. Additionally, there's a 48.0-inch full-width display on the dashboard lifted from the Nautilus. This replaces the 13.2-inch infotainment display found in previous models and is complemented by an 11.1-inch configurable display. Second-row passengers get dual 5.8-inch touchscreen displays as standard. These also serve as heated/ventilated seats and audio control panels if second-row audio and upgraded second-row seats are equipped. Given the Navigator's history of offering luxurious interiors, the 2025 Lincoln Navigator's cabin is spacious and luxurious, complete with leather seats that can accommodate eight, complemented by metal and wooden accents, adding a premium touch. Interior colors are themes, unlike the exterior colors, which are limited to only three options. These are Black Onyx, Medium Light Space Grey and Hot Chocolate.

Safety, Comfort, Convenience; All Taken Care Of

The 2025 Lincoln Navigator comes with a whole new suite of technologies. For example, with the aim of creating the ultimate retreat inside the cabin, the car comes with a Waterfall Meditation experience along with other themes to help drivers recharge during long road trips or a long day at the office, according to Lincoln. In addition to the essential driver assists, new buyers get access to BlueCruise self-drive for four years at vehicle purchase. Other premium driver assists to expect Pro Trailer Backup Assist and include Turn Signal view which projects a camera view on the adjacent lane on the stretch display.

When Should You Expect To Buy One?

Lincoln has confirmed that the all-new 2025 Lincoln Navigator will go on sale next spring. Is it worth buying? With a striking exterior that blends timeless elegance with modern flair and an interior that promises to be a serene sanctuary, it's in no doubt worth buying.
