## Work Experience

As stated above, I have worked for both the Lancashire Evening Post and Lancslive on day long work experience. Both of these taught me valuable skills which I will take with me into the future. Alongside the limited work experience I have had, I have also completed projects for university which taught me a lot.

#### 24/10/22 – Lancslive

For my day here, I was tasked with writing a travel-based story about the best restaurants in Blackpool. This took research skills and also writing skills to create a story that was both interesting and informative which I think I was able to do.

### 10/10/22 – Lancashire Evening Post

I was given a story to work on about the Leyland Warriors rugby team during my day here. I was forwarded an email from the LEP team and reached out to the organiser of Leyland Warriors. This required a variety of writing, communication and research skills to make an article which was worth publishing.

### 20/11/21 – UCLan Newsday

This particular Newsday stands out to me as one that taught me a lot of skills. For this Newsday I went to Manchester to film a transgender parade and interview organisers of the event. When we arrived, our tripod was broken. I handled the camera and filmed everything free hand. We managed to get a package together that was put into the final program. Additionally, during the Newsday I was our sport presenter, I arranged my bulletin and managed to sort out an interview on the day with Ged Mills from Talk Sport. All these elements required thinking on the spot, researching and editing skills alongside communicating with a team to create a TV program.
