To do this, navigate to the site where you purchased your domain name from. From there, go into the settings for your domain name to point your domain at the hosting server. Within your web hosting account, you should have been given name servers, known as domain name servers, or DNS. These addresses are where you point your domain name so that when people type in "www.yourdomain.com" they land on whatever content you're hosting on the server you chose.

When you've located the name servers, you need to log in to your domain name settings and click

on your "DNS Settings" tab. You then simply replace the current domain name servers with those

provided to you by your web host. When you save this, your domain will start to point to your host

The last step in the process is to get your website loaded onto your host account. Most of the

leading web hosting providers offer free one-click WordPress installation, which enables users to
