A total of 18 hours of coursework are required (6 in either the Department of Mexican American and Latina/o Studies or the Teresa Lozano Long Institute of Latin American Studies). Students learn about Latina/o/xs and film, television, new media, journalism, advertising, and popular culture in order to earn the minor, and they receive transcript recognition at the time of degree completion.
