HOW TO REGISTER

▪ **Current Boston University Students** should register online using WebReg on the Student Link. WebReg also allows you to add and drop classes, list or print your class schedule, and receive a summary of your status. You may continue to add/drop courses on the Student Link until the end of the add/drop period for your particular course(s). No changes are possible once the add/drop deadline has passed.

▪ **Visiting Students** joining us for the summer may register online or by mail/fax, as described below. No special admission is required. Visiting international students may only register using paper forms.

- Register Online

Full instructions are available at bu.edu/summer/registration/visiting. Once your login is completed, you can access the Student Link at any time to add and drop classes, list or print your class schedule, or check the status of your registration and student account.

- Register Using Paper Forms

If you are a visiting international student, or if you prefer to register by using a paper registration form, download the forms at bu.edu/summer/forms.

▪ **International Students** must register for summer courses using paper forms. Download the forms at bu.edu/summer/forms.

All visiting international students must also complete and submit additional documentation, as described at bu.edu/summer/international/visa.

Since the time to process student visa applications can be lengthy, international students should send in their completed paperwork as soon as possible.

Important Information for International Students

The International Students & Scholars Office (ISSO)

The staff at the ISSO provides information and counseling on immigration regulations, employment, cultural adjustment, and personal issues to all international students wishing to study at Boston University during the summer.

U.S. Immigration regulations require that all international students report to the ISSO immediately upon arrival on campus. Bring your Certificate of Eligibility (I-20/DS-2019), passport, I-94 card, and all previous immigration documents to:

English Language Requirement

Most academic programs at Boston University require minimum scores on the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL), as follows:

- Paper-based TOEFL: Minimum score of 550
- Internet-based TOEFL (iBT):
Minimum score of 84

Exceptions: The College of Communication, School of Education, and School of Management require minimum TOEFL scores of 600 (paper) or 91 (iBT).

Although the TOEFL is not required for summer registration, these competency levels are strongly recommended for international students who wish to study at Boston University during the summer.

Center for English Language and Orientation Programs (CELOP)

Boston University CELOP has been providing English language and U.S. cultural instruction to international students for over thirty years. The Center offers a variety of program options featuring small classes and eight levels of English ability in an environment that provides students with maximum learning potential and a high degree of personalized attention. Registration Policies At-A-Glance

Open Enrollment

There is no admission process for Summer Term courses. To enroll in a summer course, simply complete your registration as indicated.

Full Course Load

A full course load in a six-week summer session is two courses (8 credits). A total of 16 semester credits may be earned over the full 12-week Summer Term. Permission must be obtained in order to exceed a full course load. Contact the Summer Term office for more information.

Auditing

Students wishing to take Boston University Summer Term courses on an audit basis should inquire with the Summer Term office to determine whether an audit is permitted for their particular course. If approved, students are charged the same tuition as students taking the course for credit. Instructor's permission is required. All students attending and participating in a course must be officially registered. Students are not allowed to "sit-in" on summer courses.

Add/Drop Deadlines for Standard Summer Courses

For Session 1: Through Monday, May 24
For Session 2: Through Friday, July 2

Add/drop deadlines for nonstandard summer courses can be found by clicking on the course dates within the “search courses” option on the Summer Term website at bu.edu/summer/courses.

Note: Some instructors do not allow students to join their course once it has begun. It is recommended that you register for and attend summer classes by their first meeting date. During add/drop week, if you want to add a course after it has started, you should first contact the instructor to receive permission to add.

Financial Aid

Financial Aid in the summer is limited to student loans and Federal Work Study for eligible students. Students must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents and meet other requirements to qualify for federal loans. HOW TO PAY

Summer 2010 Tuition and Fees

Course tuition is determined by the number of credits, the level of the course (undergraduate or graduate), and the Boston University school or college through which it is offered.

Below are the per-credit tuition charges for Summer 2010. The total tuition for each course is also listed starting on page 12.

Tuition Charges per Credit

- Undergraduate Courses (numbered 100 to 599):
\$530 per credit
- Graduate Courses (numbered 600 to 999):
\$1,184 per credit

Exceptions:

- College of Fine Arts (music education courses on campus):
\$530 per credit
- College of Engineering (all courses numbered 500 and above):
\$1,184 per credit
- School of Education (all courses on campus):
\$530 per credit
- School of Theology (all courses on campus):
\$485 per credit
- School of Social Work (all courses on campus):
\$760 per credit
- Metropolitan College (courses numbered 100 to 599 on campus):
\$530 per credit
- Metropolitan College (courses numbered 600 to 999 on campus):
\$700 per credit

Withdrawal Credit (Refunds)

If you officially drop a standard summer course before the beginning of the summer session, you will be credited for its associated tuition and fees.

If you officially drop a standard summer course during the add/drop week (five days at the beginning of each session), you will be credited for tuition, but registration and lab fees are non-refundable.

After the add/drop period is over there are no refunds or credits made for tuition or fees. Students are responsible for all tuition and fees for any course in which they remain enrolled after the add/drop period is completed.

Additional Fees:

The following fees are not refundable once classes have begun:

Registration Fee (per session): \$40
Laboratory Fee (per course): \$200
Technology Fee (online courses): \$200
Replacement fee for student ID card: \$30
Late Payment Fees: \$75-300

Payment

Charges for tuition and fees will appear on your student account as soon as you register for classes. These charges will remain, and you will be responsible for payment, unless you officially withdraw or drop your courses(s).

Payment Deadlines

Payment is due by May 18, 2010 for Summer 1 and 12-week courses, and June 28, 2010 for Summer 2 courses. After these dates, late fees will be applied to outstanding balances.

Payment Options

Students have the option of paying their summer charges electronically on the Student Link, by check, or by credit card (if you are a part-time BU student or a new visiting student). Detailed information on how to submit payment is available at bu.edu/summer/payment.

SUMMER TERM STUDENT RESOURCES

The Student Link

The Student Link (bu.edu/studentlink) is your personal and secure online link to student records at Boston University. You can view and change personal information, look at your student account, register for classes, check your grades, confirm classroom locations, and much more.

To use the Student Link, you must have a BU login name and Kerberos password.

If you register for your courses using our online registration system, you will generate access to the Student Link as part of the process. If you register for classes using the paper registration forms, you will need to create a login name and password once you arrive on campus. You should first get your Boston University ID card at the Terrier Card office (775 Commonwealth Avenue), and then bring it to one of the IT Help Centers to obtain your login account.

Through its IT Help Centers and website, Information Services & Technology provides the Boston University community with computing and network resources for communication, coursework, instruction, and research. For IT Help Center locations and information about services, visit bu.edu/tech.

Educational Resource Center (ERC)

Located in the George Sherman Union, the ERC offers programs to help students develop the academic skills required by the University's rigorous programs. Free services include peer tutoring and a campus Writing Center. The ERC's qualified professional staff will also meet with students individually for academic advising. Housing and Dining

Summer Term students are welcome to live on campus at Boston University. Housing and dining services are available to students registered for Summer Term academic programs and to full-time matriculated Boston University students.

Double rooms and a limited number of single rooms are available in dormitory-style and apartment-style residences. All residence assignments are made on a space-available basis and according to the dates that completed forms and housing guarantee payments are received by BU Housing. Complete summer housing information and all the forms needed to apply for on-campus housing are available at bu.edu/housing. Please e-mail housing@bu.edu with any questions you may have.

A range of dining plans is available to meet the needs of each individual. The Warren Towers dining room and other retail dining locations are open throughout the summer. Students assigned to dormitory-style residences must choose one of the three summer dining plans available. For more information, visit bu.edu/housing/summer/dining.

Meals may be used for all-you-care-to-eat breakfast, lunch, brunch, or dinner meals at Warren Towers, 700 Commonwealth Avenue.

Along with dining plans, you can purchase Convenience Points in initial amounts of \$100, \$200, \$300, or any other increment of \$25. Buy them at the Terrier Card Office at 775 Commonwealth Avenue.



Physical Education, Recreation, and Dance

Boston University offers a wide variety of summer recreation courses, from outdoor activities such as sailing and rowing, to the indoor pursuits of squash and rock climbing, to wellness classes such as yoga and cardio-kickboxing. In addition to our course offerings, Boston University offers world-class recreation in its Fitness & Recreation Center, located in the Student Village at 915 Commonwealth Avenue. The facility offers two pools, a climbing wall, a two-story cardio and strength training Fitness Center, an indoor jogging track, seven courts of gymnasium space and much more. Memberships are available for purchase to summer students, faculty/staff, and alumni.

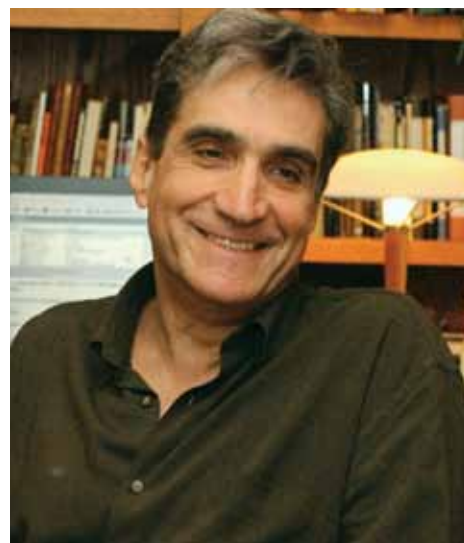
