## Admissions

The Summer Study Internship Program is open to visiting undergraduate students who are U.S. citizens or permanent residents, and who have completed at least one year of college by the start of the program.

A minimum GPA of 3.0 and good academic and judicial standing are required.

Students are accepted into one of eight academic tracks and must enroll in the full 10-credit program.

## Application Deadline

Applications are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis. Students are encouraged to submit applications as early as possible. The deadline for all applications is April 22, 2016.

# Registration



## How to Register

### Current Boston University Students

To get started, visit [bu.edu/studentlink](https://bu.edu/studentlink):

- Register online using WebReg.
- Add and drop courses.
- Confirm your course schedule and class location(s).

You may add/drop courses on the Student Link until the end of the add/drop period for your course(s). No changes are possible once the add/drop deadline has passed.

### Other College Students, Adults & Professionals

Admission to BU Summer Term is not required to take courses. Simply register online or by mail/fax:

## Open Enrollment

There is no special admission process for Summer Term courses. To enroll in a summer course, simply complete your course registration. Make sure you have fulfilled the necessary prerequisites for the courses you have chosen.

## Full Course Load

A full course load in a six-week summer session is two courses (8 credits). A total of 16 semester credits may be earned over the full 12-week Summer Term. Permission must be obtained to exceed a full course load.

## Auditing

Students may register for a class on an audit basis only when space is available and only with the permission of the instructor. Audit courses are subject to full tuition and fees. For more information, see [bu.edu/summer/auditing](https://bu.edu/summer/auditing).

All students attending and participating in a course must be officially registered. Students are not allowed to “sit-in” on summer courses.

## Add/Drop Deadlines for Standard Summer Courses

**For Session 1:** Through Friday, May 27

**For Session 2:** Through Monday, July 11

Add/drop deadlines for nonstandard summer courses can be found under each course description at [bu.edu/summer/courses](https://bu.edu/summer/courses).

Note: Some instructors do not allow students to join their course once it has begun. It is recommended that you register for and attend summer classes by their first meeting date. To add a course after it has started, contact the instructor for permission.

# Money Matters



## Summer 2016 Tuition & Fees

Course tuition is determined by the number of credits, the level of the course (undergraduate or graduate), and the Boston University school or college through which the course is offered. Below are the per-credit tuition charges for 2016. The total tuition for each course is also listed starting on page 12.

## Payment

Charges for tuition and fees will appear on your student account as soon as you register for classes. You will be responsible for payment unless you officially withdraw or drop your course(s) within the add/drop period.

### Payment Deadlines

Payment is due by May 23, 2016, for Summer 1 and 12-week courses, and July 5, 2016, for Summer 2 courses. After these dates, late fees will be applied to outstanding balances.

### Payment Options

Students may pay their summer charges online via the Student Link, or by check or credit card (if you are a part-time BU student or a new visiting student). Details are available at [bu.edu/summer/payment](http://bu.edu/summer/payment).

## Financial Aid

Financial aid in the summer is limited to student loans and Federal Work Study for eligible students. Students must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents and meet other requirements to qualify for federal loans. For more information, visit [bu.edu/finaid](http://bu.edu/finaid).

## Withdrawal Credit (Refunds)

If you officially drop a standard summer course before the beginning of the summer session, you will be credited for its associated tuition and fees. If you officially drop a standard summer course during the add/drop week (five days at the beginning of each session), you will be credited for tuition, but registration and lab fees are nonrefundable. After the add/drop period is over there are no refunds or credits. You are responsible for all tuition and fees for any course in which you remain enrolled after the add/drop period.



# Housing & Dining



On-campus summer housing is available during both summer sessions for undergraduate and graduate students who register for classes through Summer Term. Accommodations are available in both air-conditioned and non-air-conditioned dormitory-style and apartment-style residences. Rooms and apartments vary in size and design; residence rates are assessed on a per-person basis and vary according to the type of accommodation.

Interested students can complete a summer housing application online. A non-refundable housing guarantee payment of \$200 is required to reserve housing. All residence assignments are made on a space-available basis and according to the dates that online housing applications are submitted.

A range of dining plans is also available. The Fresh Food Company at Warren Towers (700 Commonwealth Avenue) and other retail dining locations are open throughout the summer. ## CHEMISTRY

### Choosing the Right General Chemistry Course:

**CAS CH 101** is the first semester of a two-semester sequence of introductory chemistry designed for science majors (biology, chemistry, biochemistry, premedical/dental) requiring two semesters.

**CAS CH 131** is a one-semester course designed for engineering majors requiring only one semester.

**CAS CH 171** is a one-semester course designed for some biological and health science majors requiring only one semester.

### Choosing the Right Organic Chemistry Course:

**CAS CH 172** is a one-semester survey course covering the fundamental aspects of organic chemistry and biochemistry, for students requiring only one semester who are interested in the biological and health sciences.

**CAS CH 203/204** is a two-semester sequence that satisfies the requirements of most students interested in pre-medicine/dentistry, other medical/health sciences, or biological sciences.

**CAS CH 203/214** is a two-semester sequence designed for students requiring a more intense laboratory experience than CH 203/204.

### Choosing the Right Biochemistry Course:

**CAS CH 273** is a one-semester course designed for some biological and health science majors requiring only one semester.

**CAS CH 421** is the first semester of a two-semester sequence designed for chemistry and biochemistry majors requiring two semesters.
