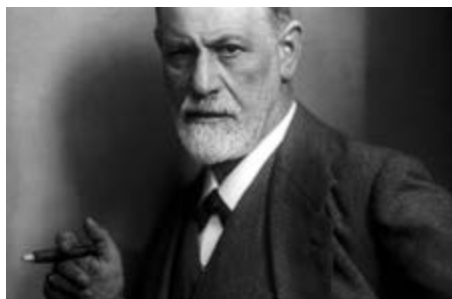

## Step-by-step auditing instructions:

1. Choose a course. Visit **[bu.edu/reg](http://bu.edu/reg)** and select "Registration," then "Class Schedule."
2. Complete the enclosed Auditing Registration Form. Failure to complete fully can cause delays in processing.
3. Attend the first class to obtain the instructor's signature (required). Acceptance is at the discretion of the instructor.\*
4. **Submit the signed registration and conduct forms, with payment to the Evergreen office** (755 Commonwealth Avenue, Suite B18) during the Spring 2016 registration periods:  
January 19–22, 25–29; February 1, 10 a.m.–3 p.m.
