## PAINT WALLPAPER

Smooth out imperfections ------- PREP Clean and sand walls, patch in wall, tape areas you don't holes or cracks. Job will want painted, prime walls. require plenty of patience.

Color versatility, easy to **PROS** Wide selection of designs, apply and cover up. textures and graphics.

Can look uneven if applied ------ CONS ------ Can be tedious to remove improperly; certain types and difficult to install, of paint will not hide depending on type of paper. imperfections in the wall. Could quickly look dated.

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## **CAN'T DECIDE?**

Consider paintable wallpaper, which offers a versatile design and the ability to color coordinate. This style generally costs from \$15 to \$30 a roll.



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
