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| <p>INTRODUCTION</p> <p>Your name, position (RN), unit you are working on</p> | <p>Hi, this is Kelsee Quesnelle, RN in the emergency room.</p> |
| <p>SITUATION</p> <p>Patient's name, age, specific reason for the visit</p> | <p>I am giving TOA on Scott Bartholemew a 52 year old male, who came into the ER with stroke symptoms starting at 10:20 this morning.</p> |
| <p>BACKGROUND</p> <p>Patient's primary diagnosis, date of admission, current orders for patient</p> | <p>The patient has a history of high blood pressure and did not take his medication this morning. The patient had symptoms of a TIA a few days ago, but did not seek medical help. No history of strokes, kidney or liver issues, patient is not taking blood thinners. No known allergies. The ER doctor assessed the patient, activated code stroke and sent the patient for a CT scan. Pharmacy was notified to mix tPA. Interventional radiology was consulted for thrombectomy.</p> |
| <p>ASSESSMENT</p> <p>Current pertinent assessment data using head to toe approach, pertinent diagnostics, vital signs</p> | <p>The patient was assessed by neurology and scored 14 on the NIH Stroke Scale. He has an 18g IV in the right AC. The patient had IV labetalol 10mg and a secondary dose of 20mg for high blood pressure. Vitals are BP 166/86, P 89, SpO2 99% on 2L O2. ECG was completed, no abnormalities. The patient received 9mg of tPA. The patient was transferred to IR for cerebral angiogram and thrombectomy, which was completed with no complications.</p> |
