New Zealand February 6–21 From \$5,995 » AHI

Experience Maori culture, exciting city life, and glacier-carved fjords on this 13-night adventure. Explore Auckland and Dunedin, witness Maori traditions and the intense haka war dance, and immerse yourself in the incomparable beauty of New Zealand. Cruise Lake Manapouri and Doubtful Sound in Fiordland National Park. Trek through the enchanting backdrops of The Lord of the Rings films and stand before the Franz Josef Glacier. Embark on an inspiring TranzAlpine train ride through the beautiful Southern Alps to Christchurch. This small-group trip features first-class accommodations, enlightening lectures, an extensive meal program, and wine with dinner.





Belize to Tikal: Reefs, Rivers, and Ruins of the Maya World March 10–18

From \$5,760 » Lindblad Expeditions

Discover the vibrant reefs of Belize and the dramatic Maya ruins of Tikal during this comprehensive land-and-sea expedition. Board the 100-guest National Geographic Quest to snorkel, kayak, Zodiac, and stand-up paddleboard along the Mesoamerican Reef, the largest reef in the Northern Hemisphere. Venture to Tikal to explore stone temples swathed in the rainforest teeming with wildlife. Experience the expansive Maya ruins, including the rarely-visited Yaxha. Explore alongside an expedition leader, veteran naturalists, a Lindblad Expeditions–National Geographic-certified photo instructor, an undersea specialist, and a wellness specialist.







Andalucía, Southern Spain: In a Parador April 11–19 From \$2,795 » AHI

Experience romantic southern Spain on a seven-night journey in Andalucía. Stay in a modern, first-class parador in Antequera and discover the history of Al-Andalus, as this region of Spain was known during eight centuries of Moorish control. See the courtyards and fountains of the Alhambra in Granada, the iconic red-and-white arches of La Mezquita in Córdoba, and the imposing Alcázar in Sevilla. Explore Ronda and Málaga and watch an entrancing flamenco performance. Enjoy special lunches at an organic winery and the Parador de Granada. Southern Africa: Luxury Safaris, Rovos Rail, & Cape Town April 28–May 13 From \$7,295 » AHI

Experience the thrill of safari, observing the calculated moves of lions, leopards, hawks, and falcons in South Africa, Botswana, and Zimbabwe on this 12-night adventure. Explore laid-back Cape Town and drive along the scenic Cape Peninsula. Walk in the footsteps of Nelson Mandela at Robben Island and visit vibrant Soweto. Feel the power of the mighty Victoria Falls and savor a taste of the golden age of travel aboard the elegant Rovos Rail. This small-group program features deluxe accommodations and an extensive meal program, including wine with dinner.







Greece: Island Life and Ancient Sites May 2–10 From \$2,295 » AHI

Experience life on the Greek island of Poros. Stroll by the sparkling sea, where octopus hang to dry outside waterfront tavernas and locals pass the time at the kafenion, the neighborhood coffee shop. From Poros, ideally located for exploring ancient Greece sites, discover the 2,400-year-old theater in Epidaurus and the ruins of Mycenae. Visit the island of Hydra and Nafplio, Greece's first capital. Visit the Acropolis and tour Athens. Enjoy first-class accommodations during two nights in Athens and five nights on Poros and an extensive meal plan, including wine with dinner.





Belgium and Holland aboard Magnifique III May 10–18 From \$4,999 » Arrangements Abroad

Enjoy an enchanting cruise through the Netherlands and Belgium from the intriguing Dutch capital of Amsterdam to the tiny Belgian town of Bruges. Follow meandering rivers and canals aboard the newly built Magnifique III, a boutique river boat with accommodations for only 36 travelers. Discover storybook villages, idyllic countryside, and outstanding art and architecture. For more active travelers, experience the Low Countries like locals do—by bike—during optional daily cycling tours.







National Parks and Lodges of the Old West June 5–14 From \$3,995 » Orbridge

Trace historic paths and marvel at the natural splendors of the Old West with an expert Orbridge Expedition Leader. Experience the storied sights and monuments of Badlands National Park, Custer State Park, Spearfish Canyon, Yellowstone National Park, and Grand Teton National Park. Paris Noir: The African-American Experience June 30–July 8 From \$3,495 » AHI

Following World War I, many African-American artists, musicians, and scholars found a home in Paris, the City of Light. Trace the rich history of the city's African-American community through specially designed walking tours and talks. View a documentary about the African-American influence in 1920s and 1930s Paris and meet the filmmakers. Enjoy quintessential Parisian experiences: the cuisine, a Seine cruise, and traveling on the Métro. This small-group program, ideal for active travelers, features first-class accommodations and an extensive meal plan, including wine with dinner.







Canadian Rockies: Parks and Resorts July 12–18 From \$3,995 » Orbridge

featuring Jennifer R. Smith, dean of the College of Arts & Sciences

Head north for a peak-season journey to the glorious Canadian Rockies and relax at legendary resorts, including Fairmont Chateau Lake Louise, Fairmont Jasper Park Lodge, and Fairmont Banff Springs Hotel. Canoe, golf, or walk nearby trails, taking in the fresh air and awe-inspiring landscapes. Go behind the scenes at the Mariinsky Theater and travel to the countryside for a folk show and vodka tasting at a traditional country house. Enjoy first-class accommodations and an extensive meal program, featuring wine with dinner.







Ancient Civilizations: Cruising the Adriatic and Aegean Seas September 15–23 From \$4,395 » Gohagan

Normandy American Cemetery, and other battle-related sites. Enjoy engaging lectures

Voyage through Vietnam and Cambodia, where lush landscapes and centuries-old culture exist in harmony. This exceptional itinerary features two nights in Vietnam's capital city of Hanoi, a seven-night cruise from Haiphong to Saigon, and three nights in Siem Reap, doorway to the magnificent, jungle-fringed temples of Cambodia. Enjoy five-star cruising aboard the newly launched Le Lapérouse, exploring Vietnam's ancient pagodas and bustling sampan-filled harbors. How do I register for a trip?

If you would like to reserve space on a trip, please contact the travel company directly. Deposits, payable by check or credit card, are required at the time of reservation. Space cannot be guaranteed until a deposit has been received.

Do I have to be a Washington University alum to participate in the Travel Program?

We welcome anyone interested in educational travel in our program. Although Washington University affiliations are an important part of our program, we welcome alumni, families and friends of students and graduates, and others who wish to participate in quality learning and travel experiences.

Do Washington University faculty accompany the trips?

Washington University faculty will accompany some of the trips listed in this brochure.

What does the price of the trip include?

Prices listed are per person, based on double occupancy. Trips generally include accommodations, coach and/or ship transportation, baggage handling, most meals and sightseeing, as specified in the trip brochure. Trips do not include passport and visa fees, some gratuities and personal travel insurance. Airfare varies by program so call the travel company for more information. All pre- and post-trip options are offered at an additional charge.

Once I've made a reservation, can I cancel?

Cancellation policies vary according to individual travel company policies. Please contact the company. Trip cancellation insurance, available for all programs, is highly recommended.

Do trips sell out?

Yes. We have a limited number of spots for each program. If the program of your choice is fully subscribed, they will place you on a waiting list. In some instances, an alternate date is scheduled.
