### Overview of the month:



The Fungi Team achieved 100% First Pass Quality, completing 72% of the FFP campaign.

They had a 100% pass rate for culture pots, with 46 pots completed and a 54% completion rate for the 2024 campaign.

They successfully produced 8x 500L Velifer 500ml batches, meeting deadlines and minimizing overtime.

They achieved a 100% pass rate for S-Batches on spores, with 36 batches completed and a 42% completion rate for the 2024 campaign.

They allocated 94% of Premix TK batches to Velifer, the highest percentage to date.

The Fungi Team's performance in the 2024 BB & FFP campaigns has been excellent and they have a lot to be proud of.

On a scale of 1-10, how excited are you about life right now and why?


Maybe a 9? I'm excited at the prospect of waking up each morning and deciding how I'm going to improve things in my little corner of the world
