Status of Cleanup

June 2023

- Property cleanup activities began May 30.
- Goal is to complete work in 2023.
- Provide final documentation of soil removal - letters of completion - after work is complete on each property.


North Fork Forest Recovery Project

North Fork Forest Recovery Project

- 1. Reduce wildfire threats around communities and infrastructure**
- 2. Restore, improve, and maintain forest resource conditions**
- 3. Protect, manage, and interpret cultural resources**
- 4. Control non-native invasive species and re-establish native plant species**

5. Make safer conditions for the public and forest workers

6. Restore the landscape around recreational features to improve forest and watershed resources

7. Improve and maintain NFS roads to protect and restore watershed health

8. Provide diverse economic opportunities

- **\$409,462.00 available in Plumas County to promote economic stability**
- **For micro-businesses with 5 employees or less including owners**
- **Apply for up to \$50,000**
- **First come first serve**
- **Changed from a forgivable loan to a grant**
- **Reporting requirements significantly reduced**
- **Program guidelines, application, and checklist anticipated to be released mid-June 2023**
- **Application deadline: July 31, 2023**
- **Workshop with updated guidelines next week**

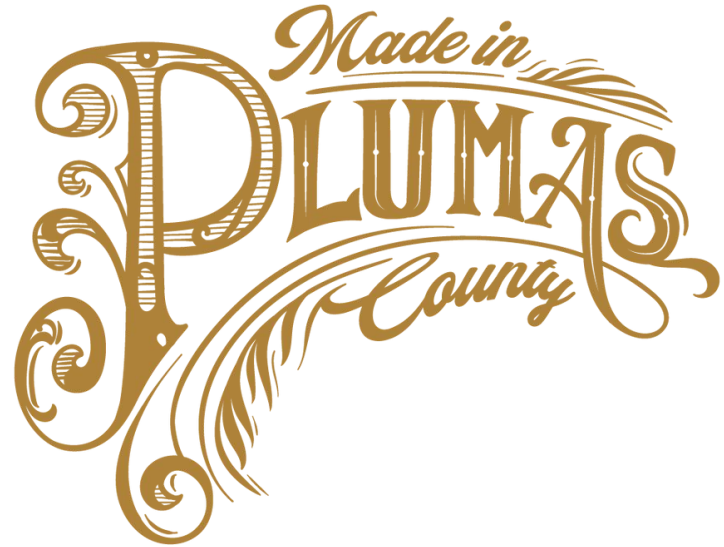
