Dixie Fire Collaborative Treasurer

Operating Procedures description:

The treasurer shall receive, deposit, and account for any financial matters of the DFC, provide regular financial reports to the general members, and perform other functions as deemed necessary by the Steering Committee.

Responsibilities:

- Attend Steering Committee Meetings on the first and third Mondays of each month, from 3:00 - 5:00 p.m., in person or via Zoom.
- 2) As a voting member, participate in all discussions and actions of the Steering Committee.
- 3) Prepare account updates for the Dixie Fire Collaborative Fund and the DFC Coordinator Dixie Fire Disaster Recovery Sub-Fund to be sent to the Steering Committee members, reported at the meetings and at the monthly Community Meetings.
- Prepare documents and send to the DFC Communications Technician to update slides for the Community Meetings.
- 5) Monitor the account balance of each fund via the Fund Advisor Portal on the North Valley Community Foundation (NVCF) website.
- 6) Complete "Requests for Payment" for invoices approved by the Steering Committee. Submit invoices and all required documents via the Fund Advisor Portal on NVCF website.
- 7) Maintain contact with personnel at NVCF who administrate the DFC Fund and Sub-fund.
- 8) Maintain financial documentation in digital form and/or paper copies.
