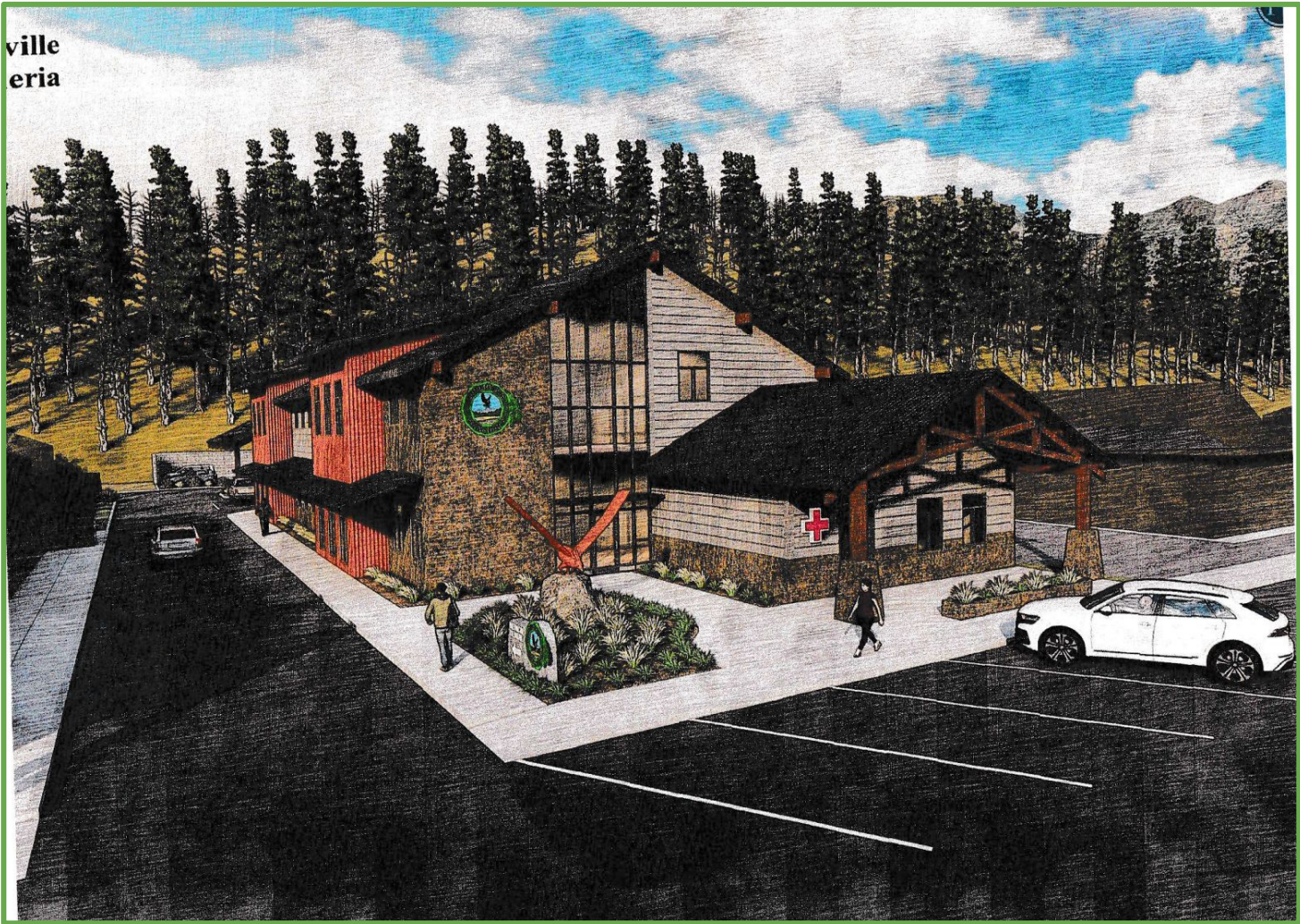

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PG&E Construction Update



- Significant ramp down in work
- Bulk of our work in the residential and downtown Greenville; end by the end of the month
 - Some trench work and underground civil work in the neighborhoods around **Alta Camp Rd, Crescent St and Cheney St. to being next week, 10/23**. Residents should have received letters, calls, and door hangers. All work is on private property.
 - PG&E looking to start one more civil construction project on **Hideaway Rd.**, awaiting approved county permits
- Down lower **Highway 70 to Bucks Creek**, work should complete by end of the month
- **Upper Highway 70 work** should complete by end of December or as weather permits
- **All work along 89 from Canyon Dam to Greenville is done for the year**
- **Work along Highway 89 to Indian Falls should be wrapped up before the end of the month**
- Our Wolf Creek Yard will close for the winter once bad weather rolls in and all of our work is stopped

Plumas County FREE Flu Vaccination Clinic Schedule:

Plumas County Public Health Agency will provide the nasal spray vaccination by appointment only at clinic (283-6330) or during the school vaccination clinics.

High dose or adjuvanted flu vaccines for 65 and older will NOT be available during the drive through clinics. Contact public health clinic at 530-283-6330 to schedule an appointment for a free high dose vaccine in the Greenville, Chester, Portola, or Quincy areas. Supplies are limited.
