Lavo has earned a celebrity following since it opened in 2008. The menu at Costa di Mare was created by chef Mark LoRusso and features his signature dishes, including whole fish that is prepared and served family-style. Guests can also choose the Feast of Seven Fishes, which is a four-course menu served family style.

Costa di Mare also offers guests an impressive selection of wines from Italy and other wine regions of the world. If there's a non-fish eater in your group, don't worry. Costa di Mare offers a vegan menu, along with pasta and other meat and poultry dishes.

Costa di Mare is considered a fine-dining Italian restaurant. Dress should be elegant business casual. Small children under the age of 5 are not permitted.
