



fish per square meter on the planet, in quantity and variety, and unique corals (such as the brain coral Mussismilia braziliensis), as well as turtles, dolphins, seahorses and many other marine species at any time of year.





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


was the battle of September 12, 1631, known as the Naval Battle of Abrolhos, fought between two squadrons – one Dutch and the other Portuguese-Spanish.


