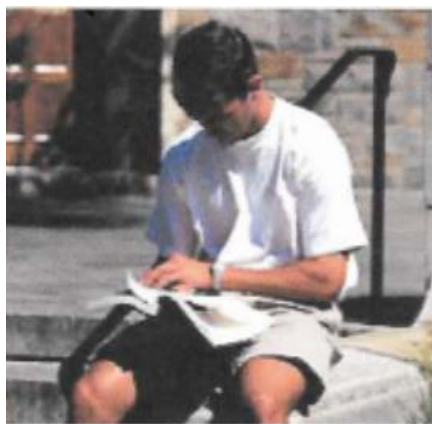
Start A Personal Relationship By Knowing God Personally

What keeps us from knowing God?

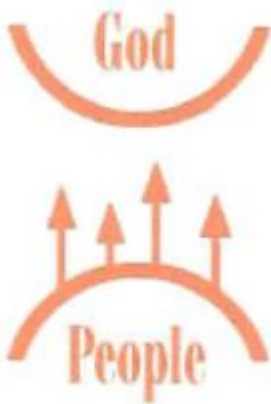

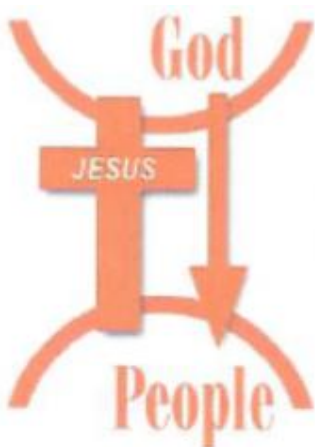
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Principle Three: Jesus Christ paid the penalty for our sins for us. He now offers us complete forgiveness and a close relationship with him.

Why Is Life So Hard?

“Why?” When life is hard, is there a way to have peace?

Life becomes hard after the Fall of Adam. Death entered into the world because of sin. Our first parents were created with the potential to live forever; when they disobeyed God’s command, they came under the penalty of sin, which is death.

- 1) Adam and Eve at this point became subject to *physical death*. God has set the tree of life in the Garden of Eden in order that by continually eating it, humans would never die. But after Adam & Eve ate the fruit from the tree of knowledge of good and evil, God pronounced these words: “For dust you are and to dust you will return” (Gen 3:19). Though they did not physically die on the day they ate, they become subject to the law of death as a result of God’s judgment. Biblically defined, physical death is the separation of the material part of humanity (the body) from the immaterial (the soul and the spirit).
- 2) Adam & Eve also died a moral death. God warned Adam that when he ate the forbidden fruit, he would surely die (Gen 2:17). This was a serious warning. Even though Adam and his wife did not die physically on that day, they died morally, i.e. their nature became sinful ever since every person has been born with a sinful nature (Rom 8:5-8), i.e., an innate propensity to go his or her own selfish way without concern of God or others (Gen 3:6; Rom 3:10-18).
- 3) Adam and Eve also died a *spiritual death* when they disobeyed God, i.e.; their former intimate relationship with God was lost (Gen 3:6). This is the reason why all kinds of human relationships have been unsuccessful and

a great failure that causes broken families, war within ourselves, war against nations, war at work and affected so many broken lives that brought to unprecedented hundreds of people suffer from anxiety and depression. People are completely alienated from knowing God in a personal way. People become more committed to living a self-sufficient life and believing having a man-made religion, believing in God, praying, doing good, and having a good moral code are enough for a ticket to heaven. Apart from Christ, we are all spiritually dead.

- 4) Finally, death as a result of sin involves eternal death. The horrible consequences of eternal death have become operative. Eternal death is eternal condemnation and separation from God as a result of disobedience (Gen 3:4), i.e.; “punished with everlasting, destruction and shut-out from the presence of the Lord (2 Th 1:9; Rom 6:16).
- 5) The only way to escape death in all its multifaceted aspects is through Jesus Christ, who “destroyed death” and has brought life and immortality to light (2 Ti 1:10). By his death he reconciled us with God thus, reversing the spiritual separation and alienation that had come as a result of sin (Gen 3:24). By his resurrection he overcame and broke the power of Satan, sin and physical death (Gen 3:15; Rom 6:10). That believers will not remain forever in the grave was already a part of the testimony of God’s OT people.

You might find yourself asking, “Why is life so hard?” Without God, humanity is easily drowning in hatred, racism, sexual abuse, and murdering each other. Jesus said, “I came that you might have life, and have it more abundantly.”

Their Story Is The Story Of All Of Us, Isn't It?

Who hasn't said -- if not audibly at least in their hearts - God, I think I can do this without you. I'll just go this one alone. But thanks for the offer. When life disconnected to Jesus Christ our spirit becomes dead and alive in the spirit of this world under the power of Satan. Satan is the god of disorder. Everything in this world is an evil force that controls the lives of people from small stuff to the biggest parts of our lives. "I am the light of the world. He who follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."¹⁸

But what about when life is unfair? What about those horrible circumstances that hit us in life, caused by someone other than ourselves? When we are feeling victimized, it's useful to realize that God himself endured horrendous treatment from others. God more than understands what you are going through.

There Is Nothing In Life That Could Be More Painful

There is nothing in life that could be more painful than what Jesus endured on our behalf when he was deserted by his friends, ridiculed by those who would not believe in him, beaten and tortured before his crucifixion, then nailed to a cross, in shameful public display, dying of slow suffocation. He created us, yet allowed humanity the freedom to do this, to fulfill Scripture, and to set us free from our sin. This was no surprise to Jesus. He was aware of what was coming, knowing all the details, all the pain, all the humiliation. "And as Jesus was going up to Jerusalem, he took the twelve disciples aside, and on the way, he said to them, 'Behold, we are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of man will be delivered to the chief priests and scribes, and they will condemn him to death, and deliver him to the Gentiles to be mocked and scourged and crucified, and he will be raised on the third day.'"¹⁹

Imagine knowing something that awful was going to happen to you. Jesus understands emotional and psychological anguish. The night that Jesus knew they would arrest him, he went to pray but took some friends with him. "And taking with him Peter and the two sons of Zebedee, he began to be sorrowful and troubled. Then he said to them, 'My soul is very sorrowful, even to death; remain here and watch [keep awake] with me. And going a little farther he fell on his face and prayed, 'My Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me; nevertheless, not as I will but as thou wills.'"²⁰ Though Jesus confided in his three friends, they didn't understand the depth of his torment, and when Jesus returned from prayer he found

them asleep. Jesus understands what it's like going through pain and extreme sadness alone.

There is no question that there is pain and intense suffering in this world. Some of it is explained by selfish, hateful actions on the part of others. Some of it defies an explanation in this life. But God offers us Himself. God gives us the knowledge that he has endured also and is aware of our pain and needs. Jesus said to his disciples, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid."²¹ There is ample reason to be afraid, and troubled, but God can give us his peace, which is greater than the problem before us. He is, after all, God, the Creator. The one who has always existed. The one who created a universe on the backstroke.

Yet even in his power, he's also the one who knows us intimately, even the smallest, insignificant details. And if we trust him with our lives, relying on him, though we encounter difficulties, he will hold us securely. Jesus said, "These things I have spoken to you, so that in me you may have peace. In the world you have tribulation, but take courage; I have overcome the world."²² He went through our ultimate threat -- death - and overcame it. He can take us through the difficult circumstances of this life, and then bring us into eternal life if we trust him.

We can either go through this life with God or without him. Jesus prayed, "O righteous Father, although the world has not known you, yet I have known you; and these have known that you sent me; and I have made your name known

What Causes Loneliness?

By God's design, we have an innate need to be loved and belong. As children, we learn to give and receive affection and are taught the skills that will help us find acceptance in society. Through our relationships with family, friends, co-workers, and others, we form our sense of individuality and find our place in the mosaic of life. It's when that need for affection and fellowship goes unfulfilled, that we become restless, unhappy...lonely.

If you are struggling with loneliness, you're not alone. Everyone experiences seasons of isolation for one reason or another. Usually, we overcome loneliness by meeting new friends, entering new social circles, or taking some other action that reengages us with people.

However, a variety of personal factors and other circumstances can sometimes short-circuit our ability to connect with others.

Loneliness doesn't develop overnight. It can be the result of a lifetime of influences that shape our personality. Or it can evolve after a major transition or trauma. Often we are unaware of the subtle forces that can slowly lead us into self-imposed isolation.

Some people tend to be loners because of circumstances in their childhood development. For example, growing up with an unaffectionate or overly critical parent may make one shy away from intimacy with others. Some people simply never learn to communicate well or get along with their peers. Others have overly aggressive or demanding personalities that make people withdraw out of intimidation. Conversely, people with low self-esteem often withdraw from social

situations they believe will lead to rejection. Loneliness can become a lifestyle for the person who struggles with poorly developed interpersonal skills.

There are also many social factors that contribute to loneliness. We live in an age in which modern technology has made it easier to do things without other people and without leaving our homes. Television is the chief culprit that robs us of time with relatives and neighbors. For some, especially the elderly, the increased likelihood of becoming the victim of a crime keeps them from venturing out of their homes. Also, because our society is more mobile than in the past, families may relocate several times for career advancement or other reasons, which tends to discourage the development of deep friendships.

Loneliness can result from "situational factors," circumstances in life that increase the possibility of isolation. People who are unmarried, divorced, or widowed are more likely to encounter loneliness simply because they are more likely to be alone. However, loneliness can also occur when a marriage relationship doesn't produce the closeness we expect. The student separated from home, the leader who must remain aloof from his subordinates, and the individual with a disability or disease -- all face a greater chance of loneliness due to a situation in their lives.

Often loneliness brought on by developmental, social, or situational factors leads to problems that only worsen loneliness. Alcoholism, drug abuse, family breakdown, and other social ills are frequently rooted in loneliness and usually lead to greater alienation from meaningful human contact. The proliferation of gangs, religious cults, and other deviant social groups can be attributed largely to people's need to belong

somewhere and their failure to find acceptance in a traditional setting.

Whatever may be contributing to your loneliness, there is a way out. It begins with confronting a cause of loneliness that every human being must come to terms with -- the spiritual loneliness of being separated from God. Each of us has a need to connect with something larger than ourselves in order to fill the spiritual vacuum that exists within us all. The Bible is God's plan for developing the most important relationship in our lives.

Loneliness And The Bible

As the story of Adam and Eve illustrates, God intends for us to share our lives with other people. The importance of personal relationships in God's eyes is evident in the amount of space devoted to them in the Bible. Both the Old and New Testaments have a lot to say about marriage, parenthood, friendship, and church fellowship. But it is also clear from God's Word that there is one relationship that is preeminent from God's point of view. That is the fellowship He wants to have with us, which forms the foundation of all other relationships.

When we accept God's gift of eternal life through Jesus Christ, we enter into communion with the Creator of the universe. God Almighty becomes our Heavenly Father and He places His Holy Spirit within us. Jesus referred to the Holy Spirit as the "Counselor" (John 14:16), whose presence would guide us into all truth (John 16:13). The Apostles Paul and John said God's Spirit would fill believers with assurance of our membership in God's family (Romans 8:16; I John 14:13). Day by day, through prayer and Bible reading, we can experience the wonderful fellowship that God wants to have with each of His children. He is never too busy to listen.

A dynamic walk with God is a solid foundation for building relationships with others. As God's children, we are members of an incredibly large extended family that encompasses the world. Our brothers and sisters inhabit every nation on the globe. Spiritually speaking, our "immediate family" is the group of believers with whom we attend church. They form an important support group that functions much like our natural family does. Christians who don't go to church or don't get involved in church activities cut themselves off from a rich source of companionship.

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If you are a Christian who is suffering from loneliness, ask yourself if you have taken full possession of the abundant life God wants you to have. Are you spending regular quality time with your Heavenly Father? Are you active in a local church? Ask God to lead you into a deeper relationship with Him and greater involvement with fellow believers.

If you have never invited Jesus Christ to be your Savior, now is a good time to do so. Making Jesus the Lord of your life will put you on a path that leads to intimacy with God, new friendships with fellow Christians in this life, and an eternal place in God's presence in the life hereafter.

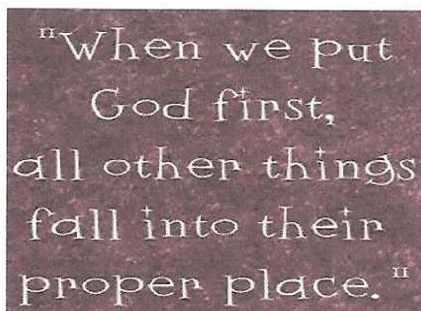
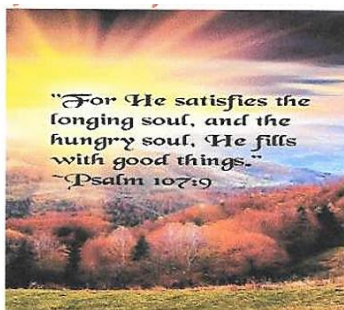
Moral Attributes of God. These moral attributes and character will bring us as our guide to a "Healthy Happy Relationship."

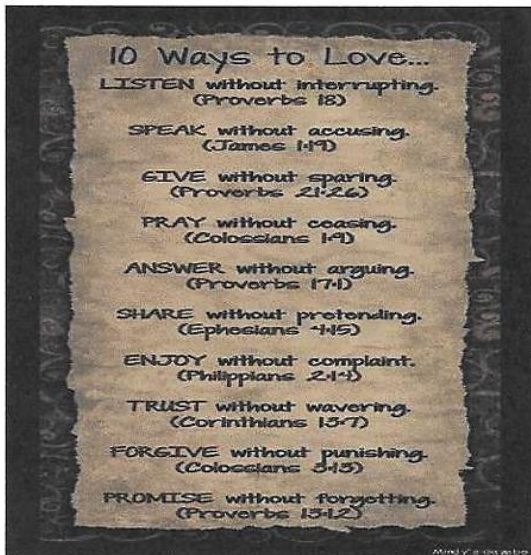

Steps For Overcoming Loneliness

Perhaps you've heard these suggestions from well-meaning friends: "Why not join a club?" or "You should do some traveling." They aren't bad ideas but they aren't solutions to the problem of loneliness either. The following steps will help you break free from thinking, emotions and behaviors that may be at the root of your loneliness. Ask the Holy Spirit to help you identify actions you can take to overcome loneliness.

Admit the Problem - Only after you acknowledge that you are lonely can you take the steps necessary to escape from your isolation.

Consider the causes - Evaluate your life honestly in light of the factors mentioned above. Do any of them apply to you?

Accept What Cannot Be Changed - The death of a spouse, a relocation away from old friends, and other unalterable circumstances must be faced squarely. 'G'od can use transitions in our lives to open doors to new experiences, but we must be willing to let go of the past and move on.

Alter What Can Be Changed - Many of the causes of loneliness discussed above can be overcome. Do you fear rejection because you feel inadequate? Do you stay in your home watching television when you could be at a social function? Has your best friend just moved away? Regardless of the reason for your loneliness, you owe it to yourself to take measures that will meet the problem head-on.

Work on developing self-esteem by stopping destructive self-talk, such as telling yourself that you are unlikable. There are many good books on the subjects of rational thinking and misbelief therapy that can help you.

Practice looking at yourself from God's perspective. Study the Scriptures and meditate on verses that depict God's view of His children. Make it a point to get out of the house at least once a week. Attend church activities; participate in community functions; take a class, etc... Get involved in a cause. There are many groups looking for faithful volunteers who want to make a difference. Of course, working for a ministry or charity is also a great way to meet people.

Develop New Habits That Build Up Your Inner Self - As you become a stronger, more self-assured person, you'll find it easier to make new friends and encounter new situations. Try some of these strategies for self-improvement: Meditate on God's Word for relaxation and to ease the effects of stress on your life.

Establish a schedule for a day, weekend or week. Loneliness often seems more intense when we have nothing to do. Organize your time and be sure to include some outside activities.

Start exercising regularly. Take walks around your neighborhood, a local park, or a shopping mall. You'll feel better physically and emotionally. Make the most out of your time alone. Aloneness (as opposed to loneliness) can be a very positive experience. Aloneness, or solitude, gives us a chance to reflect on our lives, to meditate on God's will for us and to find healing for the wounds inflicted by the world. Many experts feel that we spend too little time alone and that we would all be better off planning regular times of solitude in our lives.

Make an Effort to Make New Friends - Often all that is required to escape loneliness is the determination to seek out a new friend. Overcoming shyness and the fear of rejection are usually the biggest obstacles to initiating a friendship.

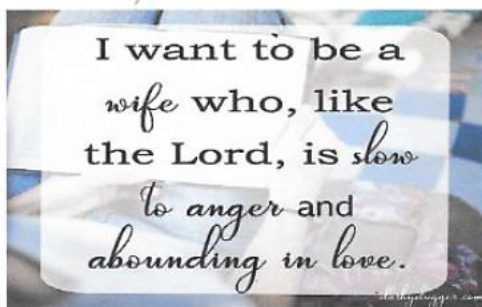
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Keep the following in mind as you try to establish new relationships:

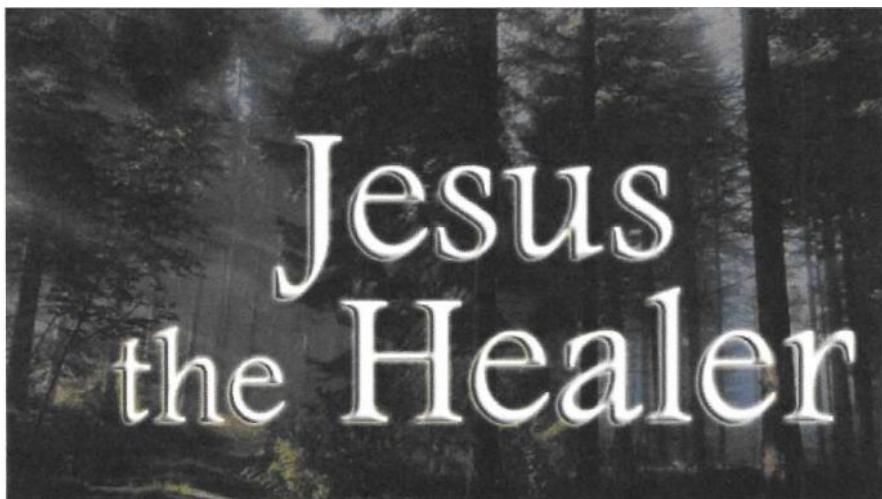

*JESUS THE ANSWER TO A
HEALTHY HAPPY SUCCESSFUL
RELATIONSHIP.*

What do you want most out of life? Most of us would rank healthy relationships high on the list. Except for knowing Christ and having eternal life, healthy relationships make life enjoyable perhaps more than anything else. Even if your health isn't the best, if you have loving relationships, you can enjoy life. You can make a pile of money, but if your relationships are broken or shallow, your life will be empty. A poor man with a loving family and good friends is far richer than a rich man who is poor relationally.

You Shall Love The Lord Your God

The Bible ranks healthy relationships as the most important thing in life. A Jewish religious expert asked Jesus (Matt. 22:36), "Teacher, which is the great commandment in the Law?" Jesus replied (Matt. 22:37-40):

"You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the great and foremost commandment. The second is like it, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' On these two commandments depend the whole Law and the Prophets."

A loving relationship with God is of first importance; but loving relationships with others is second. The Bible is all about these two important relationships.

Because the Bible emphasizes healthy relationships so highly, it's sad that there are so many believers who have hurting or broken relationships. Many Christian homes have been shattered by divorce. Some who stay married are unhappy. Their homes are a tense battle ground, not a loving refuge. Many Christian parents are at odds with their kids and the kids with their parents. On the church level, some bounce from church to church, leaving a trail of damaged relationships behind. I know of Christians who won't speak to other Christians because of misunderstandings, hurt feelings, and wrongs that have taken place. Sadly, the loving families, genuine friendships, and healthy relationships that we want most out of life often elude us.

In our text, Paul gives the prescription for healthy relationships. If you'll consistently practice these qualities, you'll have healthy relationships. But maybe you're thinking, "But healthy relationships also depend on others, don't they?"

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It's virtually impossible to have a good relationship with some people!" True. Paul acknowledged this when he wrote (Rom. 12:18), "If possible, so far as it depends on you, be at peace with all men." Sometimes, no matter what you do, some people are hard to get along with. But often if you treat a difficult person with the qualities that Paul enumerates in our text, he will change for the better in how he relates to you. But even if some relationships never improve, if you relate to others as Paul describes here, most of your relationships will be healthy.

But this isn't easy medicine to take, because to develop these qualities, you've got to kill all immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed (Col. 3:5). You've got to put aside all anger, wrath, malice, slander, abusive speech, and lying (Col. 3:8-9). And, you've got to put on "a heart of compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience; bearing with one another, and forgiving each other" (Col. 3:12b-13). The reason you should do this is because God has graciously chosen and loved you. Paul is saying, God's gracious, loving treatment of us is the basis for our treatment of others.

God Has Graciously Chosen Us In Love To Be Set Apart To Himself

Paul first gives the basis for the commands which follow, namely, how God has treated us:

1. God has graciously chosen us in love to be set apart to Himself.

Colossians 3:12a: "So, as those who have been chosen of God, holy and beloved..." "So" (or, "therefore") shows that verse 12 follows from what came before. The flow of thought is: Because we have laid aside the old man (what we were in Adam) and have put on the new man (what we now are in Christ, both individually and corporately), and because in this new corporate man old differences no longer matter, but Christ is all and in all, therefore, we should put on the qualities listed here.

Paul begins by stating that God has graciously chosen us. This means that if you're a Christian it's not because you first chose God, but because He chose you before the foundation of the world (Eph. 1:4-5). That truth should be a great comfort for every believer, but I realize that it causes problems for many. They don't like it because it seems to deny our "free will." It seems unfair of God to choose some, but not others. It seems to go against God's love for the world (John 3:16) and His desire for all to be saved (1 Tim. 2:4). So, these Christians explain election as God's choosing those whom he foreknew would believe in Him.

But if that were true, then our salvation would not be based on God's grace alone, but on something good (our faith) that God saw in us. It also presumes that sinners have the ability to believe in Christ, which contradicts many

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Scriptures. For example, Jesus said (John 6:44), "No one can come to Me unless the Father who sent Me draws him." (See, also, Luke 10:21-22; John 6:65; 8:43; Rom. 8:7-8; 9:16-18; 1 Cor. 2:14; 2 Cor. 4:4). Saving faith is a gift from God, not something that any sinner can do on his own (Eph. 2:8-9; Phil. 1:29). If God chose us based on foreseen faith, then it means that He made up His eternal plan based on what sinful people decided to do, rather than on His will (Eph. 1:11). It makes us sovereign, with God subservient to our will—a horrible thought!

There are solid biblical answers to the objections raised against the truth of election, which I don't have time to present here. The main thing is to let God be God and submit to the truth and the balance of His Word. The truth is, if you believe in Christ, it's because God appointed you to eternal life (Acts 13:48). He chose you for salvation (1 Cor. 1:27-31). The balance is, God's sovereignty never negates the human responsibility to repent and believe (see my sermon, "God's Sovereignty, Our Responsibility," on Gen. 17:1-27, 9/15/96). They're both true.

When I quit fighting what God's Word clearly teaches and submitted to it, the doctrine of election became a source of great comfort for me. It's a comfort because God's sovereign purpose to save those whom He has chosen cannot fail (see, Rom. 8:28-39). It assures me, as Paul said (Phil. 1:6), "He who began a good work in you will perfect it until the day of Christ Jesus."

Object Of God's Love

“Holy and beloved” further describe what it means to be chosen by God. To be holy means to be set apart unto God, separate from the world. Beloved means that we're the special objects of God's love, just as a wife is to her husband. We often think of holiness negatively, as telling us what we can't do. But it's a positive concept. Picture a wife who is set apart from others for her husband who loves her. She delights to keep herself from others and to give herself exclusively to him because of his love. So we too should keep ourselves pure from this evil world and be exclusively devoted to Christ, who loved us and chose us as His bride.

But why does Paul mention that we are chosen by God, holy and beloved, in the context of talking about healthy relationships? For at least two reasons. First, it's not easy to kill my selfishness and anger and to practice these Christlike qualities toward others, especially toward difficult people. But it's easier when I remember how God loved me and chose me when I was not very lovely.

Second, seeing myself as the object of God's gracious, sovereign love, set apart unto Him, frees me to love even those who are difficult to love. If I'm dependent on the other person's response for my sense of security, I won't risk loving someone who might reject me. But If I'm secure in God's love for me, I'm free to love those who may not return my love. If someone insults me, I'll feel hurt, but I don't need to retaliate. I can give a blessing instead (1 Pet. 3:9), because I'm secure in God's love for me.

That's what Paul is saying here: God's treatment of us is the basis for our treatment of others. God has chosen us in love to be set apart to Himself when we weren't worthy of

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His love. Secure in His gracious, unfathomable love, we're able to treat one another with the qualities listed here.

2. We should treat others with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, patience, forbearance, and forgiveness.

Actually, there are five nouns: compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience, which are probably set in contrast to the five sins in verse 5 and the five other sins in verse

8. "Bearing with one another and forgiving each other" describe the way in which those five virtues are put into practice. But I'm going to treat forbearance and forgiveness as two additional qualities that help our relationships be healthy.

Before we look at these qualities, I have two observations. First, every Christian should have these character qualities, but there is freedom for different personality types. In other words, all mature Christians aren't going to have the same generic personality. These qualities will take one form with a Barnabas, another with a Paul, and another with a Peter. Part of the glory of God's creation is the variety of personalities which He has given us and that He has a special purpose for each one. While He knocks the rough edges off each type of personality, He doesn't erase the differences. Whether you're hard-driving or laid back.

To Be Kind Means To Be Free

To be kind means to be free from all which is harsh, rough, and bitter. This word was used to describe wine that had mellowed (Luke 5:39). It didn't bite or leave a bitter taste. A kind person is not demanding and pushy. He gives others room to be imperfect without crawling all over them.

Joseph is a great example of kindness. His brothers had hated him and sold him into slavery. After being falsely accused of impropriety with Potiphar's wife and imprisoned for several years, he finally rose to the top as prime minister of Egypt. He easily could have taken vengeance on his brothers, but instead, he forgave them and was generous with them. After their father, Jacob, died, the brothers became afraid because they thought that perhaps Joseph would now pay them back for what they had done to him. But when Joseph heard it, he wept and spoke kindly to his brothers, assuring them of his continuing love and care for them and their children (Gen. 50:15-21).

Jesus said that God Himself is kind to ungrateful and evil men (Luke 6:35). Paul said that the kindness of God leads us to repentance (Rom. 2:4) Peter said that tasting God's kindness should motivate us to long for the sincere milk of the word, that we may grow in respect to salvation (1 Pet. 2:1-3). If we'll show kindness to those who are not kind to us, it will often motivate them to repentance and growth.

C. We should treat others with humility.

It's often said that if you think you're humble, you're not. But I find that neither helpful nor correct. It's not helpful because how can I obey the command to be humble if I can't know when I am humble? And it's not correct because Moses, Jesus, and Paul all claimed to be humble (Num. 13: 3;

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Matt. 11:29; Acts 20:19). So I think that we can know when we're being humble so that we can obey this command.

Humility does not mean that when someone pays you a compliment, you look down and say, "It really wasn't much!" Humility is not to dump on yourself. But then what does it mean? Literally, the Greek word means "lowliness of mind." The Greeks did not see it as a virtue, but as a weakness. Biblically, there are three sides to it.

God's Program

First, a humble person is Christ-sufficient, not self-sufficient. A humble person consciously relies on the Lord and recognizes that God has given him all that he has (1 Pet. 5:5-7; 1 Cor. 4:7). He knows that he is weak in himself, but he is strong when he trusts in God's strength (2 Cor. 12:9-10; Phil. 4:13).

Second, a humble person has a proper evaluation of himself. Paul said (Rom. 12:3), "For through the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think more highly of himself than he ought to think; but to think so as to have sound judgment, as God has allotted to each a measure of faith." He goes on to talk about using the gifts that God has given us to serve one another. A humble person doesn't think that he's indispensable in God's program, nor does he think so lowly of himself that he neglects the gifts God has given him to use (Matt. 25:14-30; 2 Tim. 1:6-8).

Third, a humble person esteems others more highly than himself. As Paul said (Phil. 2:34), "Do nothing from selfishness or empty conceit, but with humility of mind regard one another as more important than yourselves; do not merely look out for your own personal interests, but also for the interests of others." He goes on to cite the example of Jesus, who laid aside His glory in heaven to take on the form of a servant and go to the cross for our salvation. He esteemed us more highly than himself.

D. We should treat others with gentleness.

The King James Version translates it "meekness." There is no good single English word to translate the concept of the Greek word. It does not mean to be a mild-mannered, compliant milquetoast. The main idea is, "strength under

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submission.” It was used in classical Greek of trained animals, such as a horse which was strong and powerful in battle, but totally submissive to the warrior who rode him. The gentle person is not selfwilled, but surrendered to do God's will. Plato used the word of a gentle doctor who used only enough force (as in setting a broken bone) to bring healing. So the gentle person will sometimes be strong to confront sin, but only strong enough to bring healing (Gal. 6: 1 ; 2 Tim. 2:25).

E. We should treat others with patience.

Kindness, gentleness, and patience are listed in the fruit of the Spirit (Gal. 5:22-23). The Greek word for patience literally means, “long-tempered.” It's the opposite of having a short fuse. It means being tolerant of imperfections, differences and faults in others. The patient person gives others time to change and room to make mistakes in the process. It's a virtue that's especially difficult for those of us who are perfectionists!

F. We should treat others with forbearance.

This means putting up with someone's faults and idiosyncrasies. We need to recognize that being different doesn't necessarily mean being wrong. Let's face it, a lot of areas aren't black and white. Just because I've always done something a certain way doesn't mean that everyone else has to do it my way. We must never be forbearing when it comes to biblical moral absolutes. But we must bear with others when it comes to things the Bible doesn't clearly command.

G. We should treat others with forgiveness.

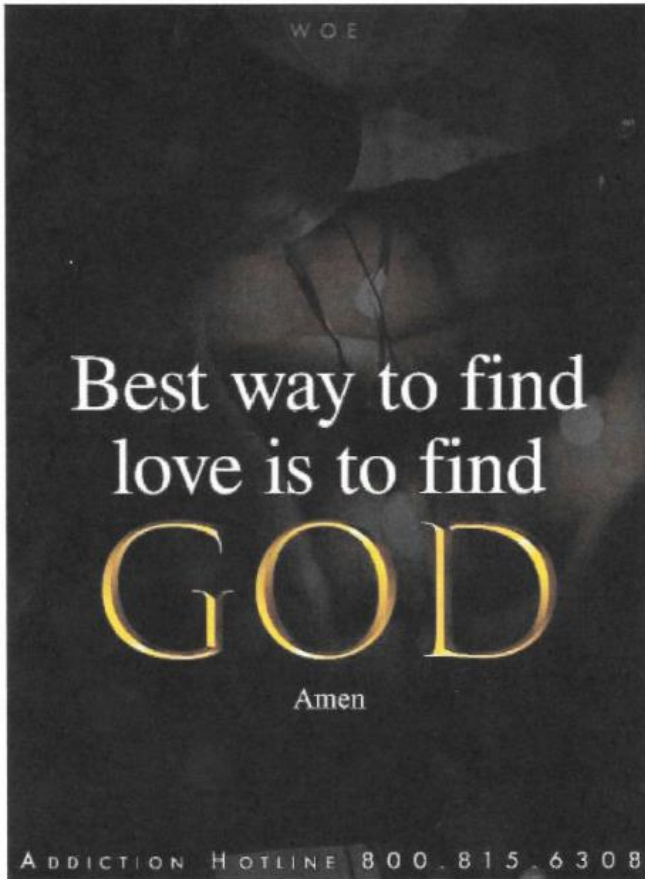
Rather than holding a grudge or harboring bitterness and resentment, we must forgive those who wrong us. Did you notice that many of these qualities are needed only when these
